No. 1041. — ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT TO THE COMMERCIAL AGREE-MENT OF MAY 4, 1921, BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND CZECHOSLO-VAKIA, SIGNED AT VIENNA, NOVEMBER 27, 1924.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE AUSTRIAN REPUBLIC and THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC, being desirous of providing more favourable conditions for the development of commercial relations between their countries, have agreed, with this object, to conclude an additional Agreement to the Commercial Agreement signed on May 4, 1921, and for this purpose have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

THE PRESIDENT OF THE AUSTRIAN REPUBLIC:

Dr. Hans Schürff, Federal Minister of Commerce and Transport;

Dr. Heinrich Mataja, Federal Minister for Foreign Affairs, and Dr. Richard Schüller, Head of Department in the Federal Chancellery.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC:

M. Kamil Krofta, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Czecho-slovak Republic at Vienna, and M. Jan Dvořáček, Minister Plenipotentiary and Head of the Department of National

Economy at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs ;

Who, after having exchanged their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:

Article I.

1. Natural and manufactured products of Czechoslovak origin coming from the Czechoslovak Republic and falling under Tariff A, which is attached as an annex to the present Agreement, shall not be subject, on importation into the Austrian Republic, to higher customs duties than those agreed upon in the said annex.

- 2. Natural and manufactured products of Austrian origin coming from the Austrian Republic and falling under Tariff B, which is attached as and annex to the present Agreement, shall Annex I not be subject on importation into the Czechoslovak Republic to higher customs duties than those agreed upon in the said annex.
- 3. As regards the above-mentioned products of Austrian or Czechoslovak origin, the present provisions shall in no way affect the right to most-favoured-nation treatment provided in Article VI of the Commercial Agreement of May 4, 1921.

Article II.

1. The duties leviable under the Czechoslovak Customs Tariff and those laid down in Annex B shall be taken as expressed in Czechoslovak crowns.

- 2. If it is found that the mean rate of the Czechoslovak crown for a whole month is at least 10 per cent above or below the mean rate for 1923 on the dollar, on sterling or on the mean rate of both those currencies, the Czechoslovak Government shall establish a coefficient of exchange which will maintain the duties leviable under the general customs tariffs and the tariffs fixed by the Agreement at the value at which they would have stood according to the mean rate of the said currencies for 1923.
- 3. In order permanently to maintain this balance of values, the Czechoslovak Government shall, if necessary, fix this coefficient of exchange at intervals of not longer than a month.
- 4. In fixing the rates of exchange, the Czechoslovak Government shall take as a basis the rates quoted on the Stock Exchanges of Prague, New York or London.

Article III.

- 1. The present additional Agreement, which is drawn up in the German and Czechoslovak languages, shall be ratified as soon as possible. The instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at Prague.
- 2. The present Agreement shall come into force on the tenth day after the exchange of the instruments of ratification. Either Government may, however, bring it temporarily into force earlier if authorised by its laws to do so.
- 3. As regards the period of validity and period of notice of denunciation, the provisions of the Commercial Agreement of May 4, 1921, shall be applicable.
- 4. In faith whereof, the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present additional Agreement and thereto affixed their seals.

Silk and half-silk tissues merely provided with simple hems or seams are not to pay duty according to the rate for sewn articles, but are merely to be subject to a surtax of 5 % on the duty leviable on the tissue itself. Pocket-handkerchiefs, table- and bed-linen and handkerchiefing, made of cotton yarn, or of the textile materials included in Class XIX with hems which, without folding over the edge of the tissue, are formed by a simple sewing of the same, or by the single or multiple folding over of the edge of the tissue (the folds being of greater or smaller breadth) and then by securing the portions folded over by sewing, whereby the tissues are neither made to present pinking (open-work hems) of any kind whatever, nor ornamented by fancy needlework or otherwise, are, on that account, neither dutiable as sewn goods nor subject to any surtax. On the above-mentioned articles, in place of the duty applicable to sewn articles, the surtax of 10 % provided for in No. 6 of the General Notes on Classes XVIII to XXII is levied, if they are provided either only with simple openwork hem (half or whole "ladder" hem) or only with a single row of perforations running parallel with the edge of the tissue in the interior of the tissue and formed in exactly the same way as the simple open-work hem, but not connected with the hem by special stitches. The so-called "spiders webs" (star-shaped ornamental stitchings) worked at the crossings of open-work hems are not to be taken into account. Textile manufactures on which are embroidered only letters, even interlaced or severally ornamented (monograms, ornamental letters, etc.) or names, numbers or the like, are not considered as embroideries. As regards made-up articles of any kind, no account is taken of wholly unimportant trimmings which, in view of the value of the article and the use to which it is put, are not in the nature of special trimmings or ornaments (e.g. chain-laces, simple bindings,	per 100 kilos.

FINAL PROTOCOL

OF THE SUPPLEMENTARY AGREEMENT TO THE COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT OF MAY 4, 1921, CONCLUDED AT PRAGUE BETWEEN THE AUSTRIAN REPUBLIC AND THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPUBLIC.

On signing this day the Supplementary Agreement to the Commercial Agreement of May 4, 1921, concluded at Prague between the Austrian Republic and the Czechoslovak Republic, the undersigned plenipotentiaries have made the following declarations, which will form an integral part of the Supplementary Agreement itself.

Ad Article III:

Both Contracting Parties declare themselves willing, at the instance of either Party, and even during the period of validity of the present Agreement, to open negotiations with a view to modifying the Agreement in order to adapt it to current developments in economic conditions or commercial policy.

As the duties leviable under this Number are based on the excise on sugar, which is now fixed at 10 gold crowns per 100 kilogrammes, and as no restrictions whatever are to be imposed on the Austrian Government in regard to the rate of that tax, it is understood that, notwithstanding the provisions of Article 1, paragraph 1 of the present Agreement, the conventional customs duties leviable under the present Number may, if the tax on sugar is altered, be raised or lowered by the same amount as the tax on sugar itself.

The difference between the customs duties leviable under No. 18 (b) and those mentioned in the Note shall not exceed 4.50 gold crowns per 100 kilogrammes, taking into account the excise on sugar.

Ad. No. 25. Barley, and Ad. No. 29. Malt.

The conventional duty of 1.50 gold crowns on barley shall apply if the autonomous (sliding) scale of duties is not more favourable.

Ad. No. 39 (a): Salad Cucumbers.

Cucumbers shall be regarded as salad cucumbers of the kind specified in No. 39 (a) of Annex A if they are 15 to 30 centimetres in length and if 60 of them weigh $4\frac{1}{2}$ kg. or more. They shall be cleared as salad cucumbers even if some of them are of a different length.

Ad. No. 46 (c) and 47 (c): Ornamental flowers, etc., and ornamental leaves, etc., whether coloured or not, impregnated or otherwise prepared for preservation.

The customs duties leviable under No. 46 (c) and 47 (c) shall also be applicable to ornamental flowers, etc., and ornamental leaves, etc., which have been prepared for preservation with glycerine or with a lye of calcium chloride, etc., lacquered, or velveted, covered with mica or bronzed.

No. 50. Hops.

The only hops which may be offered for sale in Austria as Czechoslovak hops shall be those bearing the designation prescribed by the regulations in force in the Czechoslovak Republic regarding the indication of the origin of hops and accompanied by a certificate of origin issued by the Czechoslovak Public Trade Marks Office.

They shall be offered for sale in the original packing, *i.e.* in a packing which bears the indication of origin and the lead and other seals required under the above-mentioned Czechoslovak regulations.

The indication of the origin of Czechoslovak hops referred to in the previous paragraph shall be accorded in Austria the same protection as that provided by Austrian laws for the indications of origin of sparkling wines and distilled alcoholic liquors.

- Ad. Notes to Nos. 140, 141 and 142.
- (I) "Gradl" tissues.
- "Gradl" tissues are three- or four-leaved "Gradl" twills with alternating stripes of the same width, in which the ribs run to right and left respectively.
 - (2) Ad. Note 3. Tissues of twisted yarn.

The following shall be regarded as tissues of twisted yarn: — All tissues the warp and weft of which together do not contain on the average more than three single threads to each twisted thread.

This restriction shall not apply to stamins (Kongresstoffe) and embroidered materials, which always come under the category of twisted thread tissues when they are woven with twisted thread.

Ad. No. 145. Cotton furnishing fabrics:

The following shall not be regarded as cotton furnishing fabrics:

(a) All tissues of printed cotton;

(b) Cotton velvet weighing less than 400 gr. per square metre.

(c) Other cotton tissues:

 (α) dyed in the piece;

(β) weighing less than 250 gr. per square metre.

Other cotton tissues not mentioned above shall be cleared as furnishing fabrics if, in view of their nature, they are primarily intended to be used for covering furniture (furniture covers or loose covers).

Ad. No. 180 (a) 1. "Halina" and "Hunja" cloth:

"Halina" cloth is made of coarse wool, weighing 800 gr. or more per sq. metre, and is used for various purposes (peasants' cloaks, floor-coverings, etc.).

"Hunja" cloth is made of material similar to "Halina", but is finer and smoother. As a rule it is more closely milled than "Halina" and is used for making ordinary slippers.

Ad. No. 180 (a) 2. Rugs made of waste:

Rugs of waste have a warp of vegetable textile material and a weft of cheap woollen textile waste or artificial wool; they are not washed and are therefore characterised by a greasy odour and are greasy to the touch.

Ad. No. 180 (a) 3. Fabrics for boots and shoes.

Fabrics for boots and shoes coming under this Number are strong double tissues napped on both sides; the upper layer is composed, both in the warp and in the weft, of threads of carded wool, while the weft of the lower layer is composed of carded wool and the warp of cotton; the latter also binds the upper layer. These tissues are often made of threads of different colours showing a check pattern in the upper layer.

Ad. No. 180 (c). Principles on which the ad valorem assessment of duty on woollen wares is based:

The ad valorem assessment of duty on woollen wares not specially mentioned should as a rule be based on the net price given in the invoice. Discount, etc. must therefore be deducted from the invoice price. Conversion into gold crowns must be effected at the rate of exchange current on the date of assessment. If a Czechoslovak manufacturer sells goods direct to an Austrian purchaser, the assessment is based on the invoice made out by the Czechoslovak factory. When articles in a free warehouse in Austria are sold to an Austrian purchaser by an agent or depôt of the Czechoslovak factory, the invoice to be taken as basis must be that made out by the agent or depôt for the Austrian purchaser.

If the Customs authority questions the correctness of an invoice price, recourse must be had to the arbitral procedure provided in No. 3 of Section 21 of the Austrian Customs Regulations.

Ad. No. 181. Woollen turnishing tabrics:

The following are not regarded as woollen furnishing fabrics:

(a) Woollen velvet weighing less than 450 gr. per sq. metre;

(b) Other woollen fabrics weighing less than 250 gr. per sq. metre.

Other woollen fabrics not mentioned above must be cleared as furnishing fabrics, if, in view of their nature, they are primarily intended to be used for covering furniture (furniture-covers, loose-covers).

Ad. No. 182 (a). "Sealskine":

The term "Sealskine" is applied to tissues, woven with pile, having a cotton warp and a woollen weft, whether printed or stamped or not; other woollen tissues, napped, not woven with pile, must be cleared under No. 180.

Ad. Nos. 200 and 208. Furnishing fabrics of silk or half-silk:

Materials made of dressed silk shall not be regarded as furnishing fabrics of silk or half-silk.

Ad. No. 252. Cases:

Cases are receptacles for holding articles, the interior being specially arranged for that purpose.

Ad. No. 252 (c). Cardboard boxes for pharmaceutical products:

The following shall be regarded as cardboard boxes for pharmaceutical products: Boxes for pharmaceutical purposes, (boxes with sliding lids, pill-boxes etc., and "apothecaries' boxes"), also collapsible boxes, provided that the purpose for which the box is to be used is clearly printed or otherwise shown thereon.

Ad. No. 267. Indiarubber clothing, etc.:

Under the Conventional system the Customs duty and surtax shall be based on the conventional duty leviable under Nos. 265 and 266.

Ad. Nos. 302 and 303. Souvenirs (travellers' souvenirs):

The affixing to such articles of names of regions or localities or short dedicatory inscriptions, by burning in, stamping, painting, etc. shall not be taken into account when the article is dutiable according to its component material.

Ad. No. 355. "Klinkers" and paving-stones:

The thickness shall be measured at the thinnest part; no account shall be taken, however, of hollows due to the stamping of trade or factory marks, or of any irregularities caused at the time of stamping or burning in, or of bevelled edges.

Ad. No. 376 (a). Precision steel tubing:

The term "precision steel tubing" shall be taken to mean drawn tubing of precise dimensions (thickness, calibre, etc.).

Ad. 407 (a). Cast-iron grates, stoves and drains:

Under the heading "Cast-iron grates and stoves" are included: Supports for grid-irons, "Quint" stoves, perforated heating bricks, plates, frames and rings for fuel-saving stoves, stove and oven doors, stove linings, stove supports, stove stands, flue-doors, gratings and bars for domestic grates and stoves.

Cast-iron drains include the following:

Drain gratings, man-holes and man-hole lids, drain-pipe covers.

Ad. 439 (d). 2 (a). Moss scrapers.

Moss scrapers are special agricultural machines having two rows of knives set one behind the other, for breaking up tussocks.

Ad. 441 (b) and (c). Special machines and apparatus for sugar factories, breweries and malt distilleries.

The following shall be regarded as special machinery and apparatus coming under this category, provided that the purpose for which they are intended can be proved:

A. For sugar factories:

Beet-washing machines.

Beet-slicing machines.

Diffusers and diffusing apparatus, (including air pumps forming part therof).

Presses.

Filter presses.

Residue filter presses.

Pulp removers.

"Malaxers" (including refrigerators and crystalisers).

Saturators.

Centrifugal clearers.

Apparatus for separating residue.

Decolorisers (treatment with sulphurous acid).

Milk of lime separators.

Lime slaking apparatus. Filters (open pressure filters, cistern filters, charcoal filters).

Apparatus for purifying syrup by carbonatation.

Appliances for reburning char.

Machines for pressing sugar into slabs and tablets, and cutting machines.

Sugar packing appliances.

Granulators.

Riddling machines.

Sugar-mills.

Slice drying appliances.

Wheel elevators (for raising beet slices and water).

Slice rake removers.

Slice dredgers.

Endless feeding screws for conveying slices and for pressing.

Revolving band transporters.

Trough elevators.

Stirring conduits transporters.

Beet elevators.

"Weston" centrifugals.

Loaf sugar centrifugals.

Pumps for washing-water, milk of lime, scum, juice, massecuite and syrup.

Machines for washing filter-cloths.

Char-purifying machines.

Machines for washing sugar-moulds.

B. For breweries and malt distilleries:

Mash tuns and clear mash tuns, with mechanical Stirrers.

Malt germinating machines.

Malt turners.

Malt drums, malt curing drums.

Malt mills.

Malt dressing and polishing machines.

Hop filters.

Tun hoop drivers and accessories.

Bung removers.

Automatic tun cleaners.

Spargers (automatic tun sprinklers).

Tun presses.

Machines for removing pitch from tuns.

Machines for sprinkling tuns with pitch.

Tun rolling machines.

Mash filters.

Monte jus with hop-stirring mechanism.

Hot air pipes for malt distilleries.

Ad. No. 441 (c):

Special machines and apparatus for mines, foundries and rolling-mills, and for the chemical industry.

The following shall be regarded as special machines and apparatus coming under this category, provided that the purpose for which they are intended can be proved:

A. For mines, foundries and rolling-mills:

Elevator pulleys and hoists.

Tippers.

Sifting-grates.

Rotary sieves.

Centrifugal sieves.

Sifting drums.

Charcoal purifiers.

Complete rolling installations for iron and base metals, including cold rolling and auxiliary installations (such as lever benches, rollers, levers and live roller gear beds). "Forter" valves for gas generators.

Piston blowers for blast furnaces, weighing over 800 q. Turbo-blowers for blast furnaces, weighing over 20 q.

Turbo-compressors for blast furnaces, weighing over 400 q.

B. For soap works:

Bar cutting machines.

Machines for cutting soap into shavings.

Soap mixing machines.

Soap blending machines.

Soap rolling machines.
Soap drying machines.
Automatic stamp machines.
Cooling machines.
Compressors with stamping moulds.

C. For oil tactories:

Seed crushing machines. Seed purifiers. Roasting pans. Hydraulic filter presses. Oil-cake crushers.

D. For glue factories:

Bone crushers. Glue diffusers. Glue extracting appliances. Phosphate drying appliances.

The conventional duties also apply to spare parts of machines and appliances tariffed under No. 441 (b) and (c).

Ad. 456. Children's Mail-carts.

The term "mail-cart" in this category covers wheeled chairs, usually folding, with wooden frame, seat, back, arm- and foot-rests, but without any side lining, foot-covering or hood.

Ad. 459. Automobiles, etc.

The Austrian Government reserves the right to modify the principle on which the *ad valorem* assessment of automobiles is based, or to adopt another system of assessment for automobiles.

While reserving its legal right to make an ad valorem assessment, the Austrian Government declares itself willing, pending a fresh settlement of the question of assessment, to take into account any technical information regarding automobiles of Czechoslovak origin which the Czechoslovak Government may communicate to it for that purpose.

Ad. 459 (b). Steam lorries.

As regards steam lorries, the principal separate parts will be assessed for duty according to their respective characteristics (the engine itself under No. 438, the boiler under No. 435 and the chassis, including the platform and other wagon-body parts, if any, under No. 454).

DECLARATIONS WITH REGARD TO THE CZECHOSLOVAK CUSTOMS TARIFF.

Ad. Note to Nos. 189 and 190: "Gradl" tissues.

"Gradl" tissues are three- or four-leaved "Gradl" twills with alternating stripes of the same width in which the ribs run to right and left respectively.

Ad. 229 (a). Rugs made of waste.

Rugs made of waste have a warp of vegetable textile material and a weft of cheap woollen textile waste or artificial wool; they are not washed and are therefore characterised by a greasy odour and are greasy to the touch.

Ad. 229 (b). "Tyrolese loden".

"Tyrolese loden" is a smooth tissue, not figured, of one colour (dyed in the piece or in the yarn), or of several colours (interwoven only) of tissue made of carded sheep's wool yarn, more or less closely milled and having either a smooth or napped ("camel hair loden") surface.

If the duty on woollen tissues coming under the present number is reduced below the duty leviable on Tyrolese loden, the Czechoslovak Government declares itself prepared to extend such reduction to Tyrolese loden also.

The principal custom-houses at Prague, Brunn and Bratislava shall be authorised to clear

Tyrolese loden.

Ad. 244 (a): Artificial silk, twisted or not, unbleached white, not dyed:

The Czechoslovak Government gives an undertaking that if duties on artificial silk (No. 244 a) are introduced, the conventional rates shall not exceed the following:

Artificial silk, twisted or not

(a) Unbleached white, not dyed:

Single 10.50 Czechoslovak crowns per kg. Of 2 threads, or twisted . . 14 Czechoslovak crowns per kg.

Ad. No. 274: Articles of fashion for ladies' wear:

Articles of fashion for ladies' wear comprise thin dresses, blouses, coats, dressing-gowns, pyjamas, aprons and dressing jackets.

Ad. No. 296 (a) I: Newsprint.

Newsprint consists of white paper, not hot-pressed, for printing journals, weighing more than 50 kilogrammes per square metre, in rolls not less than 30 centimetres wide and having a diameter of at least 85 centimetres.

Ad. Nos. 356, 358 and 359: Boxes:

Names of firms, trade-marks, appellations of goods, etc., branded or stamped, whether ornamental or not, shall not be taken into account for clearing purposes.

Ad. No. 358 § 4: Skis:

The fact that the point alone is fine-turned shall not justify the classification of skis under this number.

Ad. No. 400 (a): Wares of cement, etc., heraclite sheets.

Heraclite sheets made of wood chips or other vegetable fibre shall be cleared under this number if more than 50 % of the total weight consists of magnesite cement (Sorel cement).

Ad No. 466 (b): Umbrella ribs and frames:

Umbrella ribs and frames shall be regarded as "finely painted" even if covered with a coat of burnt lacquer.

Ad. Nos. 481, 483, 484, 485, 516 and 517: Fittings and mountings.

Fittings and mountings consist of the necessary accessories of machines, appliances, piping and tubing.

Ad. No. 530 (b): Note: Rabbet-ledge steels, not set:

Unfinished rabbet-ledge steels shall be cleared under No. 431 (c).

Ad. No. 553: Automobiles, etc.

The Czechoslovak Government reserves the right to alter the laws in force regarding the ad valorem assessment of goods by assessing automobiles of Austrian origin in accordance with the principles on which the present legal provisions regarding the ad valorem assessment of automobiles in Austria are based, or by substituting for the ad valorem duty on automobiles coming under No. 553 either a duty based on weight or a duty per vehicle, or else a combined duty.

Pending the introduction of fresh regulations regarding assessment, the ad valorem duty on automobiles of Austrian origin imported into the Czechoslovak Republic shall be based on the actual market prices in the country of origin, plus the cost of packing and of carriage to the Czechoslovak frontier, insurance and commission, subject, however, to the observance of § 8 of the Executive Regulations of the present Customs Law and Article X of the Commercial Agreement concluded with France on August 17, 1923.

While reserving its right to assess the value of automobiles, the Czechoslovak Government will be willing to take into account for this purpose both the invoices produced by the importers and any information as to the value supplied by competent industrial organisations of recognised standing and communicated to the Czechoslovak Government by the Austrian Government.

Ad. No. 621 (a): Sulphur dioxide.

The conventional duty shall be applied subject to the production of evidence as to the nature of the contents of packages. Such certificates must have been issued by the competent Chamber of Commerce, Trade and Industry.

DECLARATIONS REGARDING THE COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT OF MAY 4, 1921.

Ad. Article II.

As regards the purchase and sale of currency, both national and foreign, the Contracting Parties undertake not to accord to nationals or firms of the other Party more unfavourable treatment than that accorded to nationals and firms of the State which is granted most-favoured-nation treatment in this respect.

Ad. Article VIII.

The provisions of the Statute of the Danube relating to transport in transit on the Danube shall not be affected by the provisions of the present Article or of the Final Protocol relating thereto.

Ad. Article X.

As an amendment of the provisions of paragraph 3 of the present Article, it is agreed that the two Parties shall inform each other as to which authorities are competent to issue trading certificates.

Trading certificates shall be drawn up on the model provided in Article 10 of the International Convention of November 3, 1923, on the Simplification of Customs Formalities.

Ad. Article XIII.

The following text shall be substituted for paragraph 2 of this Article:

In the case of the establishment of a State tug or towing service on natural or artificial waterways or of the grant to private undertakings of the exclusive right to provide a tug or towing service, the vessels and products of one Contracting Party shall receive the same treatment as that accorded to vessels and products of the other Party, in regard to the formalities required and to the rating and collection of towage fees.

Ad. Article XIV.

The following shall be substituted for paragraph I of this Article:

The nationals of one Contracting Party shall be permitted, upon the same conditions and on payment of the same charges as nationals of the other Party, to make use of causeways and other roads, canals, locks, ferries, bridges and bridge-openings, ports and landing-stages, buoys and lights on waterways, pilotage services, store-houses, apparatus for recovery and salvage of cargo and so forth, provided that the above works and apparatus are intended for public use, whether controlled by the State, the Communes, public corporations or private undertakings.

Ad. Annex A to Article XII.

The exemption from duty provided for in paragraph (b) shall also apply to fresh vegetables (except potatoes) imported in quantities of not more than five kgs.

The provisions of paragraph (f) relating to agriculture shall apply mutatis mutandis to

pisciculture.

The necessary quantities of fish feed may be imported customs free.

Spawning carp conveyed for breeding purposes from the ponds for two-year carp (Abwachsteiche) to the breeding ponds may be temporarily admitted customs free on registration. No duty shall be leviable on carp which are missing on re-exportation provided that the loss is satisfactorily accounted for.

The annual quantity and nature of the fish feed to be imported, and the number or weight of spawning fish, shall be jointly agreed upon for each separate piscicultural establishment.

Paragraph q, sub-para. 1, shall read as follows:

Small quantities of goods in daily use for which a licence is required under ordinary circumstances (Article IX, sub-para. r, paragraph (c), may, even if they are articles of trade, be taken over the frontier personally by residents on the frontier, provided that the import duty leviable does not exceed 300 Czechoslovak crowns or 43 gold crowns.
