Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce concluded between Austria and Hungary at Budapest, February 8, 1922, with two Annexes, two Protocols and Final Protocol, signed at Vienna, April 9, 1926, and Protocol modifying the above-mentioned Additional Agreement, signed at Vienna, May 10, 1926.

German and Hungarian official texts communicated by the Representative of the Austrian Federal Government accredited to the League of Nations. The registration of this Agreement took place October 5, 1926.

akik, miután meghatalmazásaikat kicserélték és azokat jó és kellő alakban lévőknek találták, a következőkben állapodtak meg :

I. cikk.

(1) Magyar származású nyerstermények és ipari készítmények, amelyek Magyarországból érkeznek és amelyeket a jelen e gyezményhez csatolt *A* jelzésű tarifa-melléklet felsorol, Ausztriába való behozataluk alkalmával nem fognak magasabb vámok alá esni, mint amelyeket az említett melléklet megállapít.

(2) Osztrák származású nyerstermények és ipari készítmények, amelyek Ausztriából érkeznek és amelyeket a jelen egyezményhez csatolt *B* jelzésű tarifamelléklet felsorol, Magyarországra való behozataluk alkalmával nem fognak magasabb vámok alá esni, mint amelyeket az említett melléklet megállapít.

(3) E rendelkezések azonban nem érintik a legnagyobb kedvezményes elbánásra vonatkozó azt a jogot, amely nevezett magyar és osztrák származású árukat az 1922. február 8.-i kereskedelmi egyezmény III. cikke értelmében megillet.

No. 1320. — ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE CONCLUDED BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND HUNGARY AT BUDAPEST, FEBRUARY 8, 1922, SIGNED AT VIENNA, APRIL 9, 1926.

THE FEDERAL PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA and HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF HUNGARY, being desirous of establishing more favourable conditions for the development of trade and commerce between the two countries, have agreed with this object to conclude an Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce signed on February 8, 1922, and have appointed for this purpose as their Plenipotentiaries :

THE FEDERAL PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF AUSTRIA :

Dr. Rudolph RAMEK, Federal Chancellor :

HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF HUNGARY :

M. Rudolph WODIANER VON MAGLÓD, former Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary ; and

Count Ludwig AMBRÓZY VON SÉDEN UND REMETE, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Vienna ;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :

Article I.

1. Natural and manufactured products, originating in, and coming from Hungary and mentioned in the tariff contained in Annex A to the present Agreement, shall not, upon importation into Austria, be subjected to higher Customs duties than those laid down in the said Annex.

2. Natural and manufactured products, originating in, and coming from Austria and mentioned in the tariff contained in Annex B to the present Agreement, shall not, upon importation into Hungary, be subjected to Customs duties higher than those laid down in the said Annex.

3. The foregoing provisions shall not however in any way affect, in respect of the said products of Hungarian or Austrian origin, the right to most-favoured-nation treatment in conformity with Article III of the Treaty of Commerce of February 8, 1922.

Article II.

The Agreement of December 7, 1920, concerning the Determination of Questions of Traffic Policy between Austria and Hungary, which is mentioned in Article VII of the Treaty of Commerce of February 8, 1922, and given in Annex B thereof, shall be amended and supplemented by the Protocol of April 9, 1926, which is attached as Annex C to the present Additional Agreement and forms an integral part thereof.

Article III.

The two Contracting Parties undertake to apply, in respect of traffic between their countries, the provisions of the Geneva International Convention for the Simplification of Customs Formalities of November 3, 1923.

Article IV.

1. The present Additional Agreement shall be ratified as soon as possible. The instruments of ratification shall be exchanged in Budapest.

2. The Agreement shall come into force on the eighth day after the exchange of the instruments of ratification. The two Governments will, however, be prepared to put the tariff provisions and the stipulations of the Agreement connected therewith provisionally into force at an earlier date, as soon as the Agreement has been accepted in Hungary by the National Assembly.

3. The Agreement shall remain in force until denounced by one of the two Contracting Parties. In that case, it shall expire three months after the date on which notice of denunciation is given to the other Contracting Party.

4. It is, however, understood that should any vitally important branch of industry be seriously jeopardised as a result of the freedom of exchange ensured by the present Agreement, the Agreement may be denounced with one month's notice.

5. The present Additional Agreement and the Treaty of Commerce concluded on February 8, 1922, shall form a single and integral whole; consequently, the denunciation of the Additional Agreement shall simultaneously involve the denunciation of the Treaty of Commerce.

6. The present Additional Agreement is drawn up in German and Hungarian, both texts being authentic.

7. In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Additional Agreement and have thereto affixed their seals.

Done at Vienna on April ninth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

PROTOCOL.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries have agreed to modify or supplement as follows the Agreement of December 7, 1920, regarding the determination of questions of traffic policy between Hungary and Austria (Annex B of the Commercial Convention between the Republic of Austria and the Kingdom of Hungary, concluded on February 8, 1922) as supplemented by the Protocol drawn up by the Royal Hungarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs on December 7, 1920 :

(1) *In Point 1*, insert the following new third paragraph :

“ The two Contracting Parties declare that they are prepared to conclude the Agreements prescribed in the second paragraph of the Final Protocol to the International Convention on the transport of passengers and baggage by rail, signed at Berne on October 23, 1924, and in Point 1 of the Final Protocol to the International Convention on the transport of goods by rail, signed at Berne on the aforesaid date, with regard to the coming into force of the said Conventions, as soon as they have received an assurance that the said Conventions will be also applied as regards traffic between the two Contracting Parties, on the one hand, and the German Reich, the Kingdom of Italy, Switzerland and the Czechoslovak Republic, on the other hand.”

(2) *In Point 3*, first paragraph, after the words “ or through Hungary to ” insert the words “ Austria or to... ”.

(3) *In Point 3*, in the last sentence of the first paragraph, after the words “ or through Austria ” insert the words “ to Hungary or ”.

(4) *In Point 7*, for the words “ between their respective territories and between the territories of the one Party and third State across the territory of the other Party ” read “ between the territories of the one Party and the territories of the other Party, between the territories of the one Party in transit through the territories of the other Party, and between the territories of the one Party and the territories of third States in transit through the territories of the other Party.”

PROTOCOL

CONCERNING THE REGULATION OF THE QUESTION OF SEASONAL LABOURERS.

Upon signing the Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce concluded between the Republic of Austria and the Kingdom of Hungary at Budapest on February 8, 1922, the undersigned Royal Hungarian Plenipotentiaries have made the following declarations:

“ The Royal Hungarian Government is prepared to continue in future to give the most favourable possible consideration to any Austrian requirements in connection with the allocation of the surplus of Hungarian agricultural labourers to foreign countries.

“ It is understood that all applications must be received through the Austrian Government officials or through agencies authorised by the Government. Similarly, offers will be made only through the Hungarian Governmental and official agencies.

“ The detailed regulations for the engagement and assignment of agricultural seasonal labourers will form the subject of a special agreement which will be concluded by the Central Authorities of either Government designated for that purpose.

“ The immigration of seasonal labourers from third countries into the territory of either of the two States shall likewise form the subject of a special Agreement between the Contracting Parties in so far as the said persons are obliged to cross the territory of the other Contracting Party.”

The undersigned Austrian Plenipotentiary has taken cognisance of the foregoing declarations.

FINAL PROTOCOL

TO THE ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE CONCLUDED BETWEEN AUSTRIA
AND HUNGARY AT BUDAPEST, FEBRUARY 8, 1922.

Upon signing the Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce between the Republic of Austria and the Kingdom of Hungary, concluded at Budapest on February 8, 1922, the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have made the following declarations, which form an integral part of the said Additional Agreement.

RE THE AUSTRIAN CUSTOMS TARIFF.

Ad No. 40 (a) : Dried paprika beans.

The Austrian Government undertakes to introduce a duty of 32 gold Kronen per 100 kg. upon dried paprika beans (No. 40 (a) in the Tariff) as from the date of the coming into force of the present Agreement.

Ad No. 31 : Flour and meal and other milling products.

It is understood that the provisions existing at any time for the purpose of ensuring by declaration the application of the duty in force at the time of the conclusion of the purchase will apply both to corn and similarly to flour and meal and milling products.

Ad No. 31 (a) : Pearled grain.

It is understood that the duty on pearled grain will not exceed 3.40 gold Kronen per 100 kg., so long as the duty on barley does not exceed 1.50 gold Kronen per 100 kg.

Ad No. 31 (c) : Flour and meal and other milling products.

The surtax of 1.45 and 1.65 gold Kronen on the duty per 100 kg. of the above categories of corn applies only to flour and meal and milling products the exportation of which is not encouraged by direct or indirect subsidies.

It is understood that the foregoing provision does not affect *bona fide* exercise of sovereign rights.

Ad No. 91 : Mineral waters.

The following are recognised as natural cure waters (No. 91 (a) in the Tariff) :

Ferenc József water (Balatonfüred) ; Hercules, Hunyadi János, Kossuth Lajos, Loser János, and Maria cathartic waters (Budapest-Budaörs) ; Apenta, cathartic spring, Ferenc József, Rákóczy cathartic waters (Budapest-Kelenföld) ; Igmánd cathartic water (Igmánd) ; Mira cathartic water (Jászkarajenő) ; Kékkút cure water (Kékkút) ; Agnes of Moha spring (Moha) ; Parád cuer water (Parád).

The following are recognised as natural table waters (No. 91 (b) in the Tariff) :

Kristály water from Sankt-Lukas-Bad, Palatinus water from Sankt-Margarate's Island spring, Hungaria and Harmat water from the Budapest metropolitan springs.

The Royal Hungarian Government reserves the right to negotiate with the Austrian Government with a view to adding other mineral waters to the foregoing list.

Ad No. 93 : Bakers' wares.

"Cakes" (*Kakes*) are small bakers' wares cut out of a rolled paste consisting solely of flour, fat, sugar, eggs and milk ; they are compact and non-porous in consistency and crumbly. They are packed either loose in cases or boxes or in paper gabs or grease-proof wrapping paper, or in "cellophane" paper or cardboard boxes pasted down with vignettes or ribbons.

An addition of vanillin, cocoa powder (5 %), oil of lemon or other flavourings is also permitted.

The term "wafers" includes all bakers' wares similar to wafers in any form (small jugs, bottles, fishes, cigars, etc.) normally termed in the trade No. 140 (*140er Ware*).

Ad No. 98 (a) and (b) : Cheese.

It is understood that any reduction in duty which Austria may hereafter grant to any third country for cheese of any kind will also apply to similar kinds of cheese of Hungarian origin.

Ad No. 104 : Cakes and wafers (Cf. for definition No. 93) *with filling coloured brown by a small addition of cocoa.*

A small addition of cocoa is held to mean an addition not exceeding 5 %.

Ad No. 107 (g) ;

Ordinary meat preserves are held to mean Székelygulyas, Pörkölt of pork, veal or mutton, smoked meat, stuffed paprika and stuffed cabbage, game, pickled lights, etc.

Goose livers, whole sterilized in fat and ready for consumption ("*foie naturel*") and goose liver passed through the sieve and prepared as a soft *pâté* without addition of truffle ("*crème de pâté de foie gras*" = "*Ganslebercrème*") in hermetically sealed receptacles do not fall under

No. 107 (e), but are included as "Meat and pastes (other than pâté de foie gras) in hermetically sealed receptacles" under No. 107 (g).

Ad Note to No. 160: *Sheaf binders.*

Sheaf binders for reaping machines, hay and straw compressing machines, hop-pole wires and other agricultural purposes are held to mean rough, single twine of sisal or Manilla hemp in lengths of 250 to 500 metres per kilogram, and rough, two or three ply twine, mostly only loosely plaited, of European hemp (*i.e.* not of sisal, Manilla or other similar hard fibres) or of jute, in lengths of 400 to 600 metres per kilogram; both in balls weighing 1 ½ to 2 ½ kg. The Customs Administration reserves the right to satisfy itself that these articles are actually employed for the purposes stated.

Ad No. 555: *Bran, rice waste, etc.*

It is understood that feeding-flour darker in colour than the type which will benefit by the treatment accorded under No. 555 — which type will form the subject of a subsequent agreement and will be communicated to the Customs houses — will include flour of this kind from wheat and rye.

RE THE HUNGARIAN CUSTOMS TARIFF.

I.

Supplementary Agreements in respect of individual Tariff items.

Ad No. 23: *Cheese.*

It is understood that any reduction in duty which Hungary may hereafter grant to any third country in respect of cheese of any kind will also apply to similar kinds of cheese of Austrian origin.

Ad No. 153: *Candy sugar.*

In the event of a reduction in the duty for beet sugar (No. 153 in the Tariff) the duty on candy sugar will be reduced to the same rate.

Ad No. 257: *Tartaric acid.*

For the duration of the present Agreement, the Royal Hungarian Government will not introduce an export prohibition or duty for wine-lees or raw tartar.

Ad Nos. 643, 645 (a) and 653 (a). *Sole leather, leather for driving belts and leather driving belts.*

Upon the expiration of one year from the coming into force of the present Agreement, or, in the event of the conclusion before the above-mentioned date of an arrangement between Austria, Hungary, Germany and Czechoslovakia, whereby raw ox and cow hides, horse hides and calf skins of all kinds may be exported from any one Contracting Party to any other Contracting Party freely and without any kind of tax, then on the day of the coming into force of such arrangement, the duties for sole leather (No. 643 in the Tariff) will be reduced as follows:

Upon the expiration of another half-year from the day on which the above-mentioned arrangement between Austria, Hungary, Germany and Czechoslovakia comes into force, and provided that none of the three other countries mentioned above enforces an import prohibition or permit system

for finished sole leather, the duty for sole leather under No. 643 (a) (1) shall, so long as the said conditions subsist, be further reduced to the highest duty for sole leather existing in the said three States, but shall not in any case be less than 62.50 gold Kronen per 100 kg. In this case, the duties prescribed in the other sub-items in No. 643 shall be reduced in such a manner that the duties for Nos. (a) (1), (b) (1) and (c) (1) shall be in the ratio of 6 : 5 : 4 and the duties on bark tanned and mineral tanned leather under the same Number shall be in the ratio of 1 : 1.4. In this way, if the duty on No. 643 (a) (1) is 62.50 gold Kronen, the duties on the other sub-items in the same Number will be as follows :

The duty on No. 645 (a) will be reduced in each case in the same ratio expressed as a percentage as that on No. 643 (a) (1) ; similarly, the duty on No. 653 (a) will be reduced in such a manner that the difference between the said duty and that on No. 645 (a) will be constant at 75 gold Kronen.

Ad No. 727: Steel for tools and fine steel.

So long as the Royal Hungarian Government maintains the regulation at present in force, whereby steel for tools and fine steel in slabs or rough bars are dutiable under No. 725, the following surtaxes in the duties on No. 725 will be applied in lieu of the duties agreed upon in respect of Nos. 727 (a) (3), (b) (3) and (c) (3) :

II.

Observations concerning individual Tariff Numbers.

Ad No. 134 : Mineral waters.

The following waters from Austrian springs are entitled to the treatment accorded by the Agreement : Thalheimer Schlossbrunnen, Preblauer Sauerbrunnen, Deutsch-Kreutzer, Gleichenberger (Konstantinquelle, Emmaquelle, Johannisbrunnen), Sulzer Paulaquelle, Tatsmannsdorfer, Haller Jodwasser (Tassiloquelle), Badgasteiner Thermalwasser.

The Austrian Government reserves the right to negotiate with the Royal Hungarian Government with a view to adding other mineral waters to the foregoing list.

Ad No. 358 (c) : Paraffin composition candles.

This item includes paraffin composition candles containing not more than 5 % of natural wax.

Ad No. 414 (m) : Earth colours, improved by addition of more than 5 % of other materials.

This item includes pigments prepared by precipitating a colouring matter which is soluble in water (of animal or vegetable origin or from coal-tar) on a mineral basis (chalk or baryta) and fixing it by a chemical reaction so that the final product yields an insoluble solid colour. These pigments are dry and are usually placed on the market in the form of powder.

Ad No. 458 (c) : Chemically uniform medicinal compounds, prepared in tablets.

The following preparations are at present recognized as chemically uniform medicinal compound of Austrian origin : argoproton, calcihyd, diphasol, theocal, honthin, altannol, antoxurin, calcium chloro-aceticum, dichlorem, johhexarin, osmon, stryphnon.

Ad No. 458 (d) : Prepared medicines.

The contractual duties apply solely to prepared medicines and specialities of Austrian origin, which are notified (registered) and admitted for purposes of sale in Hungary in conformity with the statutory regulations.

Ad No. 489 : Wooden boxes for packing purposes.

The Customs Authorities will disregard, for revenue purposes, any coloured, burnt in or stamped trade marks, descriptions, etc., whether decorated or not.

Ad No. 495 : Other pasteboard.

Hand-made pasteboard is prepared by the worker slipping or rolling the layers of pulp of the required thickness (which must invariably be single in colour, *viz.* brown or white, or gray) on the cylinder and cutting off and removing by hand the sheets thus couched (pressed) together without passing the pasteboard on to an attached dry calender. Hand-made pasteboard prepared in this way invariably has a rough edge and is never cut square.

Machine-made pasteboard is a generic term for pasteboard prepared by a single process in a continuous roll, passed direct on to an attached dry calender and then left in rolls or cut into sheets. All kinds of pasteboard coming under the definition of " machine-made " are recognizable by the fact that the edges of the board, whether in the roll or in sheets, are always cut, *i.e.* they are never rough as is the case of hand-made pasteboard.

The term " machine-made pasteboard " includes the following kinds in use in the trade :

- (a) Machine-made pasteboard, *i.e.* pasteboard consisting of a single layer of pulp, white, brown or gray ;
- (b) Cardboard dyed in the pulp in all colours, but not in white, brown or gray ;
- (c) Duplex cardboard, *i.e.* cardboard prepared in two layers of different colours ;
- (d) Triplex cardboard, *i.e.* cardboard prepared in three layers, the inner layer being of a different colour from the outside layers ; the two outside layers may be either identical or different in colour.

All the foregoing kinds may be either glazed or not.

Ad No. 496 (a) : " Loms " packing paper.

" Loms " packing paper is packing paper prepared from the waste resulting from the manufacture of cellulose (in particular, from the so-called " twigs ", *i.e.* the particles which have lignified and are consequently removed from the cellulose pulp). " Loms " packing paper is not dyed, glazed or sized ; it weighs more than 120 gr. per square metre.

Ad Nos. 496 (b) and 499 : Hat packing paper.

Hat packing paper is smoothed on one side only, unbleached (yellowish to brown), not dyed, of coarse pulp, fairly opaque.

Ad No. 516 : Letter paper (writing paper).

The Customs Authorities will disregard, for revenue purposes, bands, ribbons, etc., of yarns of all kinds used for tying up note-paper, letter cards, envelopes, and packages of note-paper.

Ad No. 526 (c) : Albums, pocket note-books and writing-pads (blotters) for desks.

This item includes only writing-pads (blotters) with leather backs and corners. Other writing-pads (blotters) of or combined with leather fall under No. 962.

Ad No. 533 : Books, newspapers, etc.

This item includes fashion newspapers with or without text.

Ad No. 585 (b) : Covers (" Abfalldecken ").

Covers (*Abfalldecken*) are coverlets with warp of vegetable textile materials and weft of cheap spun wool waste or shoddy ; they are unwashed and are consequently characterised by a greasy smell and are greasy to the touch.

Ad Nos. 612 (e) and 614 (d) : Knitted wares and hosiery.

These items include half-shaped knitted wares and hosiery, *i.e.* wares shaped on the frame with seams at the shoulders and sleeves.

In the case of knitted wares and hosiery coming under Nos. 612 (*e*) and 614 (*d*), these wares are not dutiable under No. 633 by reason of being combined with additions essential for their use, such as ribbon borders, trimmings, stitched button-holes, buttons, eyelets, hooks, buckles, strips of leather, simple running-strings, cap or bonnet strings, tassels, rings, etc., and non-essential trimmings. For example, in upper garments, the use of any kind of textile fabrics or knitted materials for collars or cuffs, and in underwear lace trimmings sewn on or crocheted on, and not more than 2 cm. in width, will be regarded as non-essential.

Ad No. 622 (g) : Corsets.

The Customs Authorities will disregard, for revenue purposes, non-essential gussets of elastic textile materials or elastic small wares in the case of corsets without sewn on suspenders classified under small wares.

Ad No. 628 : Children's clothing.

This item consists of clothing for children from three to twelve years of age. Their decisive characteristic is that they consist solely of knickers (trousers, breeches, pants) and a blouse, or knickers (trousers, breeches, pants), and a jacket (no waistcoat).

Ad No. 631 (b) : Men's shirts.

In calculating the surtax on men's shirts, the fabric of the front will be disregarded, if the fabric comes under No. 552, No. 553 or No. 554. The foregoing stipulation does not however apply to shirt fronts manufactured from fabrics coming under No. 555, the Note, after No. 558, or other fabrics.

Ad No. 637 and 639 (b) : Women's and girls' hats.

Women's and girls' hats shaped and got up like men's and boys' hats will be dutiable like the latter.

Ad No. 639 (b) : Hats of straw, etc., for women and girls.

The term " trimmed " (*Garnitur*) is held to mean got up with a lining, leather hat-band, ribbon, stuff, string. " Trimming " does not include a simple ribbon (even braided) binding to the brim.

Ad No. 657 (a) : Top boots.

The annual contingent of 4,000 pairs will be cleared through the Customs Houses at Bozsok and Bucusu (County of Vas).

Ad No. 677 : Bathing caps.

The Customs Authorities will disregard for revenue purposes, trimmings of ribbons, net-work, knots, flowers, cocades of rubber or buttons of bone or galalith.

Ad No. 726 : Iron and steel bars.

This item includes all kinds of steel not exceeding 200 by the Brünnel scale.

Ad No. 727 : Steel for tools and fine steel.

Building steel containing 1 % chrome will be dutiable under No. 727 (a).

Ad No. 728 (a) : Iron and steel wire, not over 6 mm. thick, drawn, but not further worked.

This item includes wire of the kind described, also when glowd.

Ad No. 738 (b) : Axles for road vehicles.

Separately imported axle-boxes, without oil chamber or screw winding, but with oiling channel of soft or gray cast metal, also pressed or drawn boxes, and axle ends of soft casting, hammer-pressed or drawn will pay duty under No. 738 (b) (1).

Separately imported axle-boxes of gray casting, with oil chambers and screw winding, also caps, casings and female screws of metal or gray casting, will pay duty under No. 738 (b) (2) β.

Ad No. 773 (h) (6) : Oil and spirits cooking stoves and soldering apparatus.

Packing made of leather or rubber will be disregarded for purposes of Customs revenue.

Ad Nos. 773 (h) (5) and 774 (c) (2) : Table and household utensils and vessels, silvered, of copper or copper alloys, or of alloys containing copper.

The following goods will be regarded as utensils dutiable under these items instead of under No. 962 : coffee, tea and table services, dishes, stands for bottles and glasses, sugar casters, bread baskets, ash-trays, fire-lighting apparatus for the table, candlesticks, lamp and fire screens, in so far as they do not come within the category of ornamental and luxury goods by reason of any special ornamentation.

Ad No. 792 (b) (1) a : Curtain rods (Karnissen).

This item includes the brackets and knobs if imported with the rods.

Ad No. 795 (c) (5) : Tipping lamps, table lamps, etc., of cast brass.

Lamps made of an alloy of lead, antimony and tin will be dutiable under this item.

Ad No. 799 (d) : Ordinary kitchen and household knives.

This item includes vegetable knives, carving knives, knives for cutting up salami, etc., with common wooden handles.

Ad No. 807 (d) (2) : Other explosion and combustion engines.

This item includes crude oil engines with two times and crude oil engines with not more than 500 revolutions.

Ad No. 836 (b) (1) : *Steam baking ovens, etc.*

The descriptions "kneading and mixing machines, moulding and scoring (scalloping) machines" applies to machines for the baking industry.

PROTOCOL

CONCERNING THE MODIFICATION OF THE ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT OF APRIL 9, 1926, TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE CONCLUDED BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND HUNGARY AT BUDAPEST, FEBRUARY 8, 1922.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries have this day agreed to modify as follows the Additional Agreement of April 9, 1926, to the Treaty of Commerce concluded between the Republic of Austria and the Kingdom of Hungary at Budapest on February 8, 1922 :

(1) The Austrian Federal Government undertakes to grant the exemption from Customs duty for potatoes under No. 39 (b) (1) of the Austrian Customs Tariff.

(2) The Royal Hungarian Government waives its right to the application of the duty on draught cattle under No. 52 (b) of the Austrian Customs Tariff.

The present Protocol, which forms an integral part of the above-mentioned Additional Agreement, will enter into force on the same day as the latter.
