Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation concluded between the Two Countries on April 11th, 1931, with Annexes, Final Protocol and Arrangement relating thereto. Signed at Tallinn, July 5th, 1934.

Nº 3516. — LISAKOKKULEPE TALLINNAS 11. APRILLIL 1931¹. A. ALLAKIRJUTATUD EESTI-SOOME KAUBANDUS- JA LAEVANDUS-LEPINGULE². TALLINNAS, 5. JUULLIL 1934.

Textes officiels estonien et finnois communiqués par le ministre des Affaires étrangères d'Estonie. L'enregistrement de cet accord a eu lieu le 1^{er} octobre 1934.

EESTI RIIGIVANEM ja SOOME VABARIIGI PRESIDENT, soovides arendada ja elustada mõlema maa vahelist kaubavahetust, on otsustanud teha II. aprillil 1931. aastal allakirjutatud kaubandusja laevanduslepingule järgmised muudatused ja lisandused:

Artikkel 1.

Kaupade nimekirjad «A» ja «B», mis liidetud II. aprillil 1931. a. Eesti ja Soome vahel sõlmitud kaubandus- ja laevanduslepingule, asestatakse käesolevale liidetud uute nimekirjadega A ja B.

Artikkel 2.

II. aprillil 1931. a. sõlmitud lepingu XIII artikli viimast lõiget täiendatakse nii, et seal mainitud purjelaevad on vabastatud lootsitarvitamise kohustusest.

Artikkel 3.

Käesolev kokkulepe ratifitseeritakse ja ratifikatsioonikirjad vahetatakse Helsingis niipea kui võimalik.

Kokkulepe astub jõusse seitsme päeva pärast peale ratifikatsioonikirjade vahetamist ja maksab, olles 11. aprillil 1931. a. sõlmitud kaubandus- ja laevanduslepingu sisuline osa, nii kaua kui seegi.

Mille kinnituseks on asjakohaselt volitatud allakirjutanud käesoleva kokkuleppe ja varustanud selle oma pitseritega.

Tehtud Tallinnas, 5. juulil 1934, kahes eksemplaris, eesti ja soome keeles.

Nº 3516. — LISÄSOPIMUS VIRON JA SUOMEN KESKEN TALLINNASSA HUHTIKUUN 11 PÄIVÄNÄ 1931¹ TEHTYYN KAUPPA- JA MEREN-KULKUSOPIMUKSEEN ². ALLEKIRJOITTETTU TALLINNASSA HEINÄKUUN 5 PÄIVÄNÄ 1934.

Estonian and Finnish official texts communicated by the Estonian Minister for Foreign Affairs. The registration of this Agreement took place October 1st, 1934.

VIRON TASAVALLAN PRESIDENTTI ja SUOMEN TASAVALLAN PRESIDENTTI, haluten kehittää ja vilkastuttaa molempien maiden välistä kauppavaihtoa, ovat päättäneet tehdä huhtikuun 11 päivänä 1931 allekirjoitettuun kauppa- ja merenkulkusopimukseen seuraavat muutokset ja lisäykset.

I artikla.

Huhtikuun 11 päivänä 1931 tehdyn sopimuksen VIII artiklassa mainitut, sopimukseen liittyvät luettelot A ja B korvataan tähän lisäsopimukseen liittyvillä uusilla luetteloilla A ja B.

2 artikla.

Huhtikuun II päivänä 1931 tehdyn sopimuksen XIII artiklan viimeistä kappaletta täydennetään siten, että siinä mainitut purjealukset on vapautettu luotsinkäyttövelvollisuudesta myös lähtiessään toisen sopimuspuolen satamasta.

3 artikla.

Tämä sopimus on ratifioitava ja ratifioimiskirjat vaihdettava Helsingissä niin pian kuin mahdollista.

Sopimus tulee voimaan seitsemän päivän kuluttua ratifioimiskirjain vaihtamisesta ja pysyy voimassa, ollen huhtikuun 11 päivänä 1931 tehdyn kauppa- ja merenkulkusopimuksen olennainen osa, niin kauan kuin sekin.

Vakuuudeksi ovat tarkoitukseen asianmukaisesti valtuutetut allekirjoittaneet tämän sopimuksen ja varustaneet sen sineteillään.

Tehtiin Tallinnassa heinäkuun 5 päivänä 1934 kahtena kappaleena viron- ja suomenkielillä.

No. 3516. — ADDITIONAL AGREEMENT TO THE TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION CONCLUDED AT TALLINN ON APRIL 11TH, 1931, BETWEEN ESTONIA AND FINLAND. AT TALLINN, JULY 5TH, 1934.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF FINLAND and THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF ESTONIA, being desirous of developing and promoting trade between the two countries, have decided to introduce the following amendments and additions in the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed on April 11th, 1931.

Article T.

Lists A and B mentioned in Article VIII of the Treaty of April 11th, 1931, and annexed to the Treaty shall be replaced by the new lists A and B annexed to the present Additional Agreement.

Article 2.

Article XIII, last paragraph, of the Treaty of April 11th, 1931, shall be supplemented by a clause to the effect that the sailing vessels therein mentioned shall be exempt from the obligation of using pilots also when leaving the ports of the other Contracting Party.

Article 3.

The present Agreement shall be ratified and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged

at Helsingfors as soon as possible.

The Agreement shall come into force on the expiry of seven days after the exchange of the instruments of ratification and shall remain in force as an integral part of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation dated April 11th, 1931, for the same period as that Treaty.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries appointed for the purpose have signed the present Agreement and have thereto affixed their seals.

Done at Tallinn in duplicate, in the Finnish and Estonian languages, on this 5th day of July, 1934.

FINAL PROTOCOL.

When proceeding this day to sign the Additional Agreement to the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Finland and Estonia dated April 11th, 1931, the Plenipotentiaries of the two countries have agreed on the provisions of the following Protocol, which shall form an integral part of the Additional Agreement.

I.

With the consent of Estonia, the sale of Estonian agricultural and horticultural products from sailing vessels in Finnish ports shall no longer be permitted, but these products shall be imported into Finland in the same manner as other goods.

With the consent of Finland, the retail sale of salted Baltic herring from Finnish fishing vessels in Estonian ports shall no longer be permitted, but these goods shall be imported into Estonia

in the same manner as other goods. The inhabitants of certain districts in Finland who have received or may in future receive the right to import agricultural products from Estonia free of duty may nevertheless carry on such retail trade to an extent equivalent to the value of such imports.

The agricultural products for which such special exemption from duty is granted, the quantity of such products, and the manner in which the trade is carried on, are specified in the Note from the Finnish Ministry of Finance to the Finnish Customs Administration dated August 17th, 1933, No. 2211, a copy of which is annexed to the present Protocol. If these provisions undergo any change, the Finnish Government shall inform the Estonian Government thereof.

II.

Each Government shall appoint a committee for the execution and application of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation dated April 11th, 1931, and of the Additional Agreement thereto which has been signed this day. The duty of the committees shall be to keep in constant and direct touch with each other and to deal with questions connected with the execution of these Agreements.

The committees shall also follow the development of trade between Finland and Estonia.

They may also submit proposals with a view to promoting such trade.

The two Governments shall inform each other of the composition of the committees.

In faith whereof the Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Protocol.

Done at Tallinn on this 5th day of July, 1934, in duplicate, in the Estonian and Finnish languages.

AGREEMENT REGARDING APPLES.

Estonian apples may be imported into Finland free of duty, on the following conditions:

(1) The Estonian Government restricts the export of apples to Finland during the autumn months, fixing the quantity exportable during September, October and November at 200 tons, an amount which may not be exceeded without the permission of the Finnish Government. In other months, the export of apples to Finland shall be unrestricted.

The Finnish Government shall have the right to determine the distribution of the above-mentioned quotas over the individual months from September to November, subject to the condition that the quantity allowed for any one month be not less than 40 tons.

(2) The Estonian Government shall centralise the exportation of apples by granting a sole concession to some business firm of good repute, which shall make offers and sell apples only to a Finnish business firm recommenced by the Finnish Government.

In case the Finnish firm recommended by the Finnish Government refrains from purchasing the apples offered to it, the Estonian Government shall have the right to authorise the purchase of the unsold apples by the Central Federation of Finnish

- Co-operative Stores (S. O. K.) or by some other Finnish business firm of good repute long established in the fruit trade, the Estonian Government informing the Finnish Government beforehand of the change of buyer.
- (3) The Estonian Government shall arrange for the offers of apples to Finland to be made in accordance with a classification of qualities corresponding to the wishes of the Finnish firms.
- (4) The "Antonovka" apples sold during the present year for future delivery to Finnish jam manufacturers may be transferred by the Estonian firms to these manufacturers direct.
- (5) The apples shall be exported from Estonia in accordance with the Estonian Government's regulations regarding quality and packing; these regulations shall take account of the wishes of the Finnish firms.
- (6) The Estonian Government shall authorise the collection and purchase of apples in Estonia by the fruit-trading firms recommended by the Finnish Government.
