Supplementary Convention to the Extradition Treaty of January 6th, 1902, and to the Additional Convention of November 6th, 1905. Signed at Washington, May 6th, 1936.

No. 3991. — SUPPLEMENTARY CONVENTION ¹ TO THE EXTRADITION TREATY OF JANUARY 6TH, 1902, AND TO THE ADDITIONAL CONVENTION OF NOVEMBER 6TH, 1905, BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND DENMARK. SIGNED AT WASHINGTON, MAY 6TH, 1936.

English and Danish official texts communicated by the Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States of America at Berne. The registration of this Supplementary Convention took place November 3rd, 1936.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF DENMARK AND ICELAND, agreeing to add to the list of extraditable crimes mentioned in Article II of the Treaty² for the extradition of criminals, signed at Washington on January 6th, 1902, and in Article II of the additional Convention³, signed November 6th, 1905, by means of an additional Convention, have to that end appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA:

Cordell Hull, Secretary of State of the United States of America; and

HIS MAJESTY THE KING OF DENMARK AND ICELAND:

Mr. Otto Wadsted, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Washington;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in due and good form, have agreed upon the following Articles:

Article I.

In addition to the crimes and offenses mentioned in Article II of the Treaty between the United States of America and Denmark for the extradition of criminals, signed at Washington on January 6th, 1902, and in Article II of the additional Convention signed on November 6th, 1905, extradition shall be granted also for:

Crimes and offenses against the bankruptcy laws, provided the act in the United States of America is punishable as a felony and in Denmark may involve punishment of imprisonment for one year or a more severe penalty.

Article II.

The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Treaty of January 6th, 1902, and shall be ratified according to the respective laws of the two Contracting Parties. The ratifications shall be exchanged at Washington as soon as possible.

In testimony whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention both in the English and Danish languages and have affixed their seals to it.

Done in duplicate, at the City of Washington, this sixth day of May, nineteen hundred and thirty-six.
