RESOLUTION 910 (1994)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 3363rd meeting, on 14 April 1994

The Security Council,

<u>Taking note</u> of the letter dated 6 April 1994 from the Permanent Representative of the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya to the United Nations to the Secretary-General (S/1994/402) and the letter dated 13 April 1994 from the Permanent Representative of Chad to the United Nations to the Secretary-General (S/1994/424), and the annexures thereto,

<u>Welcoming</u> the agreement signed at Surt on 4 April 1994 between the Governments of Chad and the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya concerning the practical modalities for the implementation of the judgment delivered by the International Court of Justice on 3 February 1994 regarding the Aouzou strip,

 $\underline{\text{Having considered}}$ the letter of the Secretary-General dated 13 April 1994 (S/1994/432) advising of his intention to send a reconnaissance team to the area to conduct a survey of conditions on the ground regarding the possible deployment of United Nations observers to monitor the withdrawal by Libya from the area in question,

<u>Recognizing</u> that the team will need to travel to Libya by United Nations aircraft and that this will require an exemption from the provisions of paragraph 4 of resolution 748 (1992) of 31 March 1992, and <u>acting</u>, in this respect, under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

- 1. <u>Decides</u> that paragraph 4 of resolution 748 (1992) of 31 March 1992 shall not apply in respect of United Nations aircraft flying to or from Libya for the purpose of conveying the Secretary-General's reconnaissance team;
- 2. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to inform the Committee established pursuant to resolution 748 (1992) of flights made to or from Libya in accordance with the present resolution.
