## RESOLUTION 930 (1994)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 3393rd meeting, on 27 June 1994

The Security Council,

<u>Recalling</u> its resolutions 772 (1992) of 17 August 1992 and 894 (1994) of 14 January 1994,

Noting with great satisfaction the establishment of a united, non-racial and democratic government of South Africa,

<u>Welcoming</u> General Assembly resolutions A/RES/48/13 C and A/RES/48/258 A of 23 June 1994,

1. <u>Welcomes</u> the final report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Observer Mission in South Africa (UNOMSA) (S/1994/717);

2. <u>Commends</u> the vital role played by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and UNOMSA, together with the Organization of African Unity, the Commonwealth and the European Union, in support of the establishment of a united, non-racial and democratic South Africa;

3. <u>Decides</u> that, with the successful completion of its mandate, UNOMSA is terminated forthwith;

4. <u>Also decides</u> that it has concluded its consideration of the item entitled "The question of South Africa" and hereby <u>removes</u> this item from the list of matters of which the Council is seized.
