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## RESOLUTION 1097 (1997)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 3741st meeting, on 18 February 1997

The Security Council,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the deteriorating situation in the Great Lakes region, in particular eastern Zaire, and <u>expressing</u> serious concern over the safety of refugees and displaced persons whose lives are in danger,

<u>Welcoming</u> the letter dated 18 February 1997 from the Secretary-General to the President of the Council (S/1997/136) regarding progress in the efforts to resolve the crisis in the Great Lakes region,

Reaffirming the Statement by the President of the Council of 7 February 1997 (S/PRST/1997/5),

<u>Reaffirming also</u> the obligation to respect national sovereignty and territorial integrity of the States of the Great Lakes region and the need for the States of the region to refrain from any interference in each other's internal affairs,

<u>Underlining</u> the obligation of all concerned to respect strictly the relevant provisions of international humanitarian law,

<u>Reiterating</u> its support for the joint United Nations/Organization of African Unity Special Representative for the Great Lakes region in the fulfilment of his mandate, and <u>underlining</u> the need for all Governments in the region and the parties concerned to cooperate fully with the mission of the Special Representative,

1. <u>Endorses</u> the following five-point peace plan for eastern Zaire, as set out in the letter from the Secretary-General of 18 February 1997:

- Immediate cessation of hostilities;
- Withdrawal of all external forces, including mercenaries;

- Reaffirmation of respect for the national sovereignty and the territorial integrity of Zaire and other States of the Great Lakes region;
- Protection and security for all refugees and displaced persons and facilitation of access to humanitarian assistance;
- Rapid and peaceful settlement of the crisis through dialogue, the electoral process and the convening of an international conference on peace, security and development in the Great Lakes region;

2. <u>Calls on</u> all Governments and parties concerned to cooperate with the joint United Nations/Organization of African Unity Special Representative for the Great Lakes region to achieve lasting peace in the region;

3. <u>Decides</u> to remain actively seized of the matter.

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
