SIR,

In pursuance of my Note No 12557 of August 19, 1921, I have the honour to confirm that the Royal Hungarian Government and the Royal Bulgarian Government have agreed that the commercial and economic relations between Bulgaria and Hungary shall, as from August 9, 1921, be regulated, in all respects, on terms of reciprocity, and in accordance with the most-favoured-nation clause.

This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of three months after denunciation by either of the two Contracting Parties.
