No. 1262. — PROVISIONAL CUSTOMS AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GERMAN REICH AND SWITZERLAND. SIGNED AT BERNE, NOVEMBER 6, 1925.

The German Government and the Swiss Government have agreed to open negotiations at Berlin in December 1925, for the conclusion of a Customs treaty, and as a preliminary thereto, to hold conversations in Munich in November 1925, regarding the duties on embroidery and the embroidery finishing trade. In order to facilitate the mutual exchange of goods pending the conclusion of the Customs treaty, the two Governments have further agreed to make provisional arrangements for this period forthwith in respect of a number of Customs duties. For this purpose through their undersigned Plenipotentiaries:

FOR THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT:

Herr Joachim Windel, Councillor of Legation in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs;

FOR THE SWISS GOVERNMENT:

Herr W. Stucki, Director of the Commercial Section in the Federal Department for Economic Affairs;

Professor E. Laur, Director of the Swiss Peasants Union;

Dr. E. Wetter, Delegate of the Central Office of the Swiss Association of Trade and Industry;

M. A. GASSMANN, Director-General of Customs:

They have agreed as follows:

Article 1.

Swiss products of the soil and of industry set forth in Annex A shall not, upon import into German Customs territory, pay any higher duties than those specified in the said Annex.

Article 2.

German products of the soil and of industry set forth in Annex B shall not, upon import into Swiss Customs territory, pay any higher duties than those specified in the said Annex.

Article 3.

The present Agreement shall be ratified. It shall enter into force on the day following the exchange of the instruments of ratification, which shall take place at Berne as soon as possible, and it shall remain in operation until it is replaced by a definitive Customs treaty or until it is terminated by denunciation. It may be denounced by the giving of one month's notice at any time after February 1, 1926.
