No. 1328. — DECLARATION ² CONCERNING THE RECIPROCAL APPLICATION OF THE CONVENTION ³ RELATING TO CIVIL PROCEDURE, CONCLUDED AT THE HAGUE, JULY 17, 1905. SIGNED AT RIGA, NOVEMBER 15, 1924.

French official text communicated by the Latvian and Swedish Ministers for Foreign Affairs. The registration of this Declaration took place October 15, 1926.

With a view to determining in regard to various matters the legal relations between the Latvian Republic and the Kingdom of Sweden, the undersigned, duly authorised for this purpose by their respective Governments, have agreed to the following declaration:

The provisions of Articles I to 24 of the Convention concerning civil procedure, concluded between several Powers at The Hague on July 17, 1905, shall be applied in Latvia in favour of Sweden and Swedish nationals, and in Sweden in favour of Latvia and Latvian nationals.

The present declaration shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible. The Agreement shall take effect one month after the exchange of ratifications; it shall remain in force until April 27, 1929. As from that date it shall be renewed by tacit agreement every five years unless denounced by one of the Parties. The denunciation must be notified at least six months before the expiry of the aforesaid periods.
