No. 326. EXCHANGE OF NOTES¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERN-MENTS OF AUSTRALIA AND OF ITALY CONCERNING A GIFT OF WOOL TO ITALY. LONDON, 5 AND 8 JULY 1948

Dear Mr. High Commissioner,

On instructions received from my Government I have the honour to inform that the Italian Government is hereby entering in an agreement with the Australian Government in the following terms:

1. The Government of Australia will supply without charge to the Government of Italy Australian wool to the value of £250,000 (Australian), the descriptions and qualities thereof to be agreed upon by the Governments of Australia and Italy and also in relation thereto to pay the costs of procurement, storage, transportation and shipping to the port of entry into Italy.

2. The Government of Italy will nominate as its Agent an Australian wool buying broker, such nomination to be subject to the approval of the Government of Australia. Such broker will be authorised to arrange in consultation with and with the approval of the Government of Australia for the procurement, storage, transportation and shipment of such wool.

3. The Government of Italy, through its agent authorised as above, will, from time to time, submit in advance to the Government of Australia a statement of the descriptions and qualities of wool required which will be subject to screening and approval by the Government of Australia. Procurement will be authorised for the quantities, types and qualities of wool so approved.

4. The Government of Australia will retain ownership of such wool up to the time of its arrival in the port of entry into Italy.

5. The raw wool provided by the Government of Australia and articles processed therefrom, will be distributed without any discrimination based on race, language, sex or religious or political beliefs.

6. Such wool will not be used for the maintenance of armed forces or any other military or similar purpose.

7. The Government of Italy will take appropriate steps to make known to the people of Italy the origin of the wool and the purposes for which it is being provided by the Government of Australia.
