- No. 451. AGREED MINUTES¹ OF THE TRADE DISCUSSIONS OF THE MIXED COMMISSION OF NORWAY AND THE UNITED STATES, UNITED KINGDOM AND FRENCH OCCUPIED ZONES OF GERMANY. (FRANKFURT AM MAIN, 14-17 FEBRUARY 1949). SIGNED AT FRANKFURT AM MAIN, ON 17 FEBRUARY 1949
- 1. During 14-17 February 1949 a Norwegian Delegation met with the Authorities of the Three Western Zones of Germany. Trade between Norway and the Bizone after July 1948 was reviewed and arrangements were made whereby trade between Norway and the French Zone would be included in the existing agreements between Norway and the Military Governments for Germany (United States/United Kingdom).
- 2. Additional trade items were included by both sides and increases were made for the items already scheduled in the lists attached to the Trade Agreement, 30 July 1948. The revised trade lists are attached as Annex A 1 and B.
- 3. During the discussions the existing payments agreement was revised to include the French Zone.
- 4. The Norwegian Delegation stressed the urgent need for iron and steel for reconstruction in Norway, and expressed regret that the quota for rolled steel products in the current agreement could not be increased to a greater extent. They earnestly requested that Norway's requirements be taken into consideration in the 1949/50 export program of the Three Western Zones. The Authorities of the Three Western Zones agreed to give sympathetic consideration to this request.
- 5. The question of deliveries under the trade agreement of mechanical wood pulp was discussed. It was agreed that the possibility existed of concluding contracts satisfactory with regard to prices and other particulars. The Authorities of the Three Western Zones of Germany stated that they expected to be able to grant import licenses up to 30,000 tons dry weight in addition to the licenses already granted for 14,000 tons making a total of about 44,000 tons, roughly \$3.3 million in value.

6. The Norwegian Delegation expressed the desire to have copper concentrates or copper ore refined in Germany and will supply coal or coke for this purpose. It is not believed that this work can be undertaken until August 1949.
