No. 1236. EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN NORWAY AND ITALY CONCERNING THE MUTUAL ABOLITION OF VISAS. ROME, 24 JULY 1950

Rome, 24 July 1950

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that the Norwegian Government is prepared to give effect to the following measures as from 15 August 1950:

- 1. Italian subjects may enter Norway and Norwegian subjects may enter Italy, provided that they are furnished with valid national passports. These passports need not be provided with a consular visa.
- 2. Nationals of either of the two Contracting States shall be subject to the laws and police regulations in force in the other State concerning the entry, residence and employment or occupation of foreigners.
 - 3. The present agreement shall come into force on 15 August 1950.
