No. 1061. PROTOCOL ¹ CONCERNING THE EXCHANGE OF GOODS AND THE SETTLEMENT OF PAYMENTS BETWEEN DENMARK AND POLAND FOR THE PERIOD 1 OCTOBER 1950 TO 30 SEPTEMBER 1951. SIGNED AT WARSAW, ON 30 NOVEMBER 1950

The two Contracting Parties have agreed upon the following:

Article 1

In accordance with the Agreement of 7 December 1949 ² concerning the exchange of commodities between the Kingdom of Denmark and the Republic of Poland, quota list A (Danish exports to Poland) and quota list B (Polish exports to Denmark) annexed to this Protocol have been established for the period 1 October 1950 to 30 September 1951.

The lists replace lists A and B for the period 1 October 1949 to 30 September 1950.

Article 2

Quotas contained in the aforesaid lists A and B not utilized by 30 November 1950 shall become invalid.

Export and import permits shall, however, be granted for quantities or values of goods enumerated in these lists in respect of which commercial transactions have been concluded.

Article 3

For the period ending 1 July 1951 the technical credit mentioned in article 1 of the Additional Protocol to the Payments Agreement between the Kingdom of Denmark and the Republic of Poland of 14 December 1948, signed on 7 December 1949,³ shall be increased to 35 million Danish kroner.

Provided that, if so required by payments for ships, the sum of 35 million Danish kroner may be temporarily exceeded.

As from 1 July 1951 the said credit shall return to its former level of 25 million Danish kroner.

Article 4

Article 2 of the Additional Protocol to the Payments Agreement between the Kingdom of Denmark and the Republic of Poland of 14 December 1948, signed on 7 December 1949, shall read as follows:

"In accordance with article II (n) of the Payments Agreement of 14 December 1948, it is agreed that sums due to the Danish merchant marine for the transport of goods between Polish ports and ports in Sweden, Norway, Finland, Germany, Great Britain, Ireland, the Netherlands, France, Belgium and the Mediterranean shall be paid in Danish kroner, in accordance with article 1 of the said Agreement.

"It is further agreed that these sums may not exceed 10,000,000 Danish kroner in all."

Article 5

The provisions of the Additional Protocol to the Agreement concerning the exchange of commodities between the Kingdom of Denmark and the Republic of Poland, signed at Copenhagen on 7 December 1949,² shall apply also to industrial products included in the lists of goods A and B established for the period 1 October 1950 to 30 September 1951.
