LIQUIDATION PROTOCOL¹ BETWEEN THE PEO-No. 1552. PLE'S FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA AND THE HUNGARIAN REPUBLIC ON THE SETTLEMENT OF DEBIT BALANCES ARISING OUT OF THE OPERATION OF THE AGREEMENT<sup>2</sup> ON EXCHANGE OF GOODS AND THE NON-COMMERCIAL PAYMENTS AGREE-MENT<sup>8</sup> SIGNED IN BELGRADE ON 23 DECEMBER 1946. SIGNED AT BUDAPEST, ON 18 MARCH 1948

Having established that not all the contracts concluded in 1947 under the Agreement<sup>2</sup> on exchange of goods have been fulfilled, so that the accounts thereof could not be balanced, the Government of the People's Federal Republic of Yugoslavia and the Government of the Hungarian Republic have agreed as follows:

#### Article 1

Whereas the trading account for 1947 opened in accordance with the Agreement on exchange of goods has been found to show a balance in favour of Hungary, the Yugoslav Contracting Party shall make further deliveries (up to 31 May 1948) under contracts not fulfilled before the date of signature of the present Protocol, and the value of such deliveries shall be applied in settlement of that debit balance.

The Hungarian Contracting Party shall fulfil contracts concluded by it in 1947, but not fulfilled before the date of signature of this Agreement, under the account for 1948 referred to in articles 2 and 3 of the Agreement<sup>4</sup> on payments arising out of the exchange of goods signed this day.

#### Article 2

If on 31 May 1948 the trading account for 1947 still shows a balance in favour of Hungary, the Joint Commission shall be convened to determine the additional deliveries of goods required for the complete settlement (by 30 June 1948) of the debit balance on the trading account for 1947.

If the Yugoslav debit balance is settled by Yugoslav deliveries not later than 31 May 1948, the said account shall be closed and Yugoslav deliveries shall be accounted in the trading account for 1948.

#### Article 3

The Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia and the Government of the Hungarian Republic have agreed that, in order that the dinar and forint accounts for 1947 opened under the Agreement<sup>1</sup> on non-commercial payments may be settled by 30 April 1948, existing contracts concluded within the 1947 quotas shall be fulfilled under those accounts. Lists and delivery dates of those commodities are contained in annexes A and B hereto.

#### Article 4

In establishing the debit balances on the dinar or forint accounts, the value in dinars or forints of goods consigned before 30 April 1948 as certified by bills of lading, and the value of goods for which payment was not made at the appropriate time through no fault of the importer, shall be deducted.

#### Article 5

This Protocol shall come into force on the date of signature and shall remain in force until the account for 1947 has been completely balanced.

This Protocol was done in Budapest on 18 March 1948 in duplicate in Serbo-Croat and Hungarian.
