The Royal Iraqi Legation present their compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Commonwealth Relations, and have the honour to inform them that the Iraqi authorities concerned, have authorised the Legation to grant the following visas without referring the request to them.

- 1. Pakistanis recommended by the Pakistan Government (gratis).
- 2. Pakistanis who go to Ziarat to the Holy Places in Iraq (Rs. 11/2).
- 3. Persons who go in transit (10 annas).
- 4. Persons whom the Legation find that there is no objection of their going to Iraq (entry, Rs. 11/2/—; transit 15 days, Rs. 1/2/—; non-stop, —/10/—).

The Legation request the Ministry that similar facilities be granted to Iraqi subjects, who would like to come to Pakistan.

The Royal Iraqi Legation avail themselves of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry the assurances of their highest consideration.
