No. 2202. COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN DENMARK AND ITALY. SIGNED AT COPENHAGEN, ON 28 OCTOBER 1952

The Danish Government and the Italian Government, in order to regulate commercial exchanges between their countries within the framework of European economic co-operation, have agreed on the following provisions :

Article 1

The two Governments shall apply all measures which have been or will be taken in accordance with OEEC decisions to goods originating in and produced in each of the two countries.

All liberalization measures taken or to be taken in accordance with such decisions shall therefore apply automatically to goods originating in and produced in Italy and Denmark respectively.

Article 2

The two Governments undertake to license the import or export, as the case may be, of the goods shown in lists A and B attached to this agreement up to the quantities or values specified.

The two Governments similarly undertake to license the export of the goods specified in lists C and D attached to this Agreement, namely goods the import of which into Denmark and Italy, as the case may be, has been liberalized within the framework of OEEC, up to at least the quantities or values provided for guidance in the above-mentioned lists, if the export of the said goods is or will be subject to licensing.

Article 3

Payments arising out of the reciprocal commercial exchanges shall be regulated in accordance with the provisions of the Payments Agreement signed at Copenhagen on 4 October 1950.²

Article 4

In order to promote the development of commercial exchanges between Italy and Denmark, a Joint Commission composed of representatives of the two Governments shall be constituted.

The function of the Commission shall be to supervise the application of the present Agreement and to formulate proposals for the improvement of economic relations between Italy and Denmark.

The Joint Commission may meet at the request of either of the Parties.

Article 5

The present Agreement shall come into force on the date of its signature, with retroactive effect as from 15 October 1952, and shall expire on 14 October 1953.
