The Danish Ambassador presents his compliments to the Honorable the Secretary of State and with reference to previous correspondence regarding the registration with the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) of frequencies used by the United States authorities in Greenland has the honor to inform the Secretary, that the Government of Denmark accepts the proposal of the Government of the United States, that a bilateral agreement be entered into between the two Governments on this subject.

Based upon previous correspondence and subsequent verbal negotiations the Government of Denmark understands that the Government of the United States is prepared to conclude an agreement in the following terms :

The frequencies listed in the enclosure to this note, all of which are registered with the International Telecommunication Union under the identification "Greenland", are being used by the United States authorities in Greenland.

When the use by the United States authorities no longer exists, the Administration of the Government of Denmark will be so informed and will request the ITU to delete the frequencies from the ITU frequency list, unless by mutual agreement between the two Governments other arrangements concerning certain frequencies are made.

In the event it should become necessary in the future for the United States authorities to use additional frequencies in Greenland the frequencies in

question will be coordinated with the Danish authorities, and if the proposed use is concurred in by them the Danish authorities will notify the frequencies to ITU as "Greenland". Subsequently, such additional frequencies will also be deleted from the ITU registration list by the same procedure outlined above for the frequencies now in use.

All requests by the United States authorities for deletion of frequencies or addition of frequencies or alteration in the frequency list enclosed in this note are to be made to the Administration of the Government of Denmark through the Department of State.

A reply by the Government of the United States to the effect that these terms are acceptable to the United States authorities will be considered as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.
