Athens, 24 July 1953

With reference to the recent conversations held at Athens between this Legation and the Greek Ministry of Foreign Affairs concerning trade between Sweden and Greece during the period 1 July 1953 to 30 June 1954, I have the honour to submit the following proposals:

- 1. In view of the scope of the liberalization measures applied to imports in both Sweden and Greece, it has not been considered necessary to prepare lists as provided in article 2 of the Trade Agreement between Sweden and Greece of 25 June 1948 regulating the volume or value of Swedish or Greek goods to be exchanged during the period in question. Such trade will therefore be governed by the liberalized export and import arrangements in force in the two countries.
- 2. Pending the introduction of new Greek regulations concerning the importation of machinery into Greece, the Swedish Government reserves the right to raise this matter again.

I should be grateful if you would signify the Greek Government's agreement to the foregoing.
