The Greek Minister for Foreign Affairs to Her Majesty's Ambassador at Athens

ROYAL MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS

Athens, March 7, 1955

Monsieur l'Ambassadeur,

With reference to the discussions between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy on the subject of the questions arising from the administration of the Dodecanese by the British military authorities, I have the honour to inform your Excellency that the Royal Hellenic Government are willing to conclude with Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland an arrangement on this matter in the following terms :—

A .-- Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom waive :

- (a) All claims arising from the costs already incurred by Her Britannic Majesty's Government in respect of the British Military Administration in the Dodecanese;
- (b) All claims for the sum of 7,381,000 Ægean lire which were in a blocked account in the Rhodes branch of the Bank of Italy in the name of the British Administration, and which were taken over by the Greek authorities.
- B.-On their side the Greek Government waive :
 - (a) All claims arising from the redemption by the Greek Government of the notes of the British Military Administration which were put into circulation by the British military authorities during the existence of the British Military Administration.

- (b) In their own name and in the name of all the inhabitants of the Dodecanese all claims arising from the occupation of the Dodecanese by the British military authorities.
- C.—The present arrangement covers all claims of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, whether they arise from any expenses of the British Military Administration, or from the abandonment *in situ* of stores of food or from any other cause arising from the military administration of the Dodecanese by the British authorities.

If Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are in agreement with the foregoing, I propose that the present Note, together with your Excellency's reply, should constitute an agreement between the two Governments in this matter.
