No. 3083. TRADE AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE KING-DOM OF GREECE AND THE ROMANIAN PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT BUCHAREST, ON 19 MAY 1954

The Royal Government of Greece and the Government of the Romanian People's Republic, desiring to develop trade between the two countries, have agreed on the following provisions:

Article 1

Within the framework of the system in force in each of the two countries, both Governments undertake to facilitate to the greatest possible extent the importation and exportation of goods from one country to the other.

Article 2

The Greek Government shall permit the exportation to the Romanian People's Republic of the goods shown in schedule B annexed hereto up to the quantities or values specified therein.

The Government of the Romanian People's Republic shall permit the exportation to Greece of the goods shown in schedule A annexed hereto up to the quantities or values specified therein.

The two Governments shall grant the corresponding import and export authorizations in so far as these are necessary under the system in force in each of the two countries.

It is understood that the goods imported into each of the two countries shall be intended for domestic use.

Article 3

The two Parties shall give sympathetic consideration to the possibility of increasing the quotas specified in schedules A and B annexed hereto, and also that of adding to the said schedules goods not included therein.

Article 4

Payments relating to the commercial exchanges provided for in this Agreement shall be effected in accordance with the Payments Agreement² signed this day.

Article 5

The two Contracting Parties shall give very sympathetic consideration to any proposals that may be made by either Party with respect to the conclusion of multilateral transactions.

Article 6

The two Contracting Parties agree that raw materials may be sent from either of the two countries to the other under the temporary admission system for conversion into finished products and re-exportation to the country of origin.

All expenses incurred in the conversion of these raw materials into finished products shall be met by shipment of an additional quantity of raw materials or other goods of the exporting country, or by means of clearing arrangements.

Contracts made between the parties concerned for such conversion operations shall be subject to prior approval by the competent authorities of the two countries.

Article 7

The two Governments shall establish a Joint Commission consisting of representatives of the two Parties. The Commission shall be responsible for supervising the application of this Agreement and for submitting to the two Governments any proposals for improving commercial relations between the two countries. It may also modify and supplement the schedules annexed to this Agreement.

The Joint Commission shall meet at the request of either of the Contracting Parties alternately at Athens and at Bucharest.

Article 8

This Agreement shall enter into force on 1 June 1954 and shall remain in force until 30 June 1955. Unless denounced three months before its expiry, this Agreement and the schedules annexed thereto shall be deemed to be renewed by tacit agreement for a further period of one year. The two Contracting Parties may, however, terminate this Agreement at any time after the expiration of the first year by giving three months' notice.

After the termination of the Agreement, all obligations deriving from the Agreement shall be discharged in accordance with its provisions.
