Amman, May 7, 1958

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to our recent discussions concerning the proposals for an interest-free loan by the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to the Government of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan during the financial year ending the 31st of March, 1959, to be used for the purposes of economic development within the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan in that year. Acting upon instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I now have the honour to propose the following terms:

- (a) The Government of the United Kingdom will advance to the Government of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, by instalments as required, an interest-free loan of a total sum of £630,000 during the financial year ending the 31st of March, 1959;
- (b) The loan shall be spent in the course of the said financial year on the development of the Aqaba port and of the desert road between Amman and Ma'an (including bridging);
- (c) The loan shall be repaid by the Government of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to the Government of the United Kingdom in ten equal annual instalments of £63,000 beginning on the 1st of April, 1964;
- (d) The Government of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan shall regard as finally discharged any possible obligation on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland in connexion with the loan for the financial year ending on the 31st March, 1957.

If the foregoing terms are acceptable to the Government of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply in that sense should be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments in this matter.
