Sir,

I have the honour to propose that the Government of Ghana shall afford overflying, landing and staging facilities in Ghana to State aircraft of the United Kingdom and dependent territories and other aircraft on charter to Her Majesty's Forces, and that the Government of the United Kingdom for their part shall afford similar facilities on a reciprocal basis in the United Kingdom and its dependent territories to State aircraft of the Government of Ghana.

State aircraft of the United Kingdom and dependent territories and other aircraft on charter to H. M. Forces shall be permitted to fly over Ghana provided that (a) at least twenty-four hours notice shall be given through the normal operational air traffic control channels, and (b) the necessary air traffic control procedures are followed. If a landing is intended at any airfield in Ghana at least forty-eight hours notice shall be given to the Director of Civil Aviation of the Government of Ghana through the normal operational air traffic control channels to enable the necessary arrangements to be made. For State aircraft of Ghana flying in or over the United Kingdom and dependent territories, the same arrangements shall apply except that advance notice of landing may, if this course is more convenient, be given direct to the airfield concerned.

In this letter the reference to dependent territories does not include the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland or the Maldive Islands.

If this is agreeable to you, I suggest that this letter, together with your reply, shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments in the terms of the above proposal, which shall enter into force today.
