No. 4956. EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT<sup>1</sup> BETWEEN BELGIUM AND SPAIN CONCERNING THE GRANT OF FREE PASSPORT VISAS FOR VISITS OF MORE THAN THREE MONTHS. MADRID, 11 SEPTEMBER 1959

Madrid, 11 September 1959

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to inform you that the Belgian Government is prepared to accede to the request of the Spanish Government and to abolish on a reciprocal basis the consular fees for passport visas still payable by Belgian and Spanish nationals intending to stay in Spain and Belgium respectively for periods exceeding three months.

With effect from 1 October 1959, visas for temporary residence will be issued free of charge to Spanish nationals proceeding to Belgium with the intention of staying for periods exceeding three months.

The present letter and your reply in similar terms will be deemed to constitute the formal agreement between our two Governments.
