Athens, May 14, 1959

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to state, on the instructions of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom agree to the payment of the sum of $\pounds 691,187$ to the Royal Greek Government in final settlement of the outstanding claims between the two Governments known as the Diverted Cargoes Claims and summarised in this Embassy's Note No. 216 of the 12th of July, 1957. I annex a copy² for ease of reference.

Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom acknowledge that, in settlement of a claim originally made by the Anglo-Saxon Petroleum Company, acting as agents for Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, in respect of certain advance payments, which were made to the Greek firm of Messrs. Vayanis and Cairactidis in connexion with the hire of the vessels *Prodromos* and *Chrysorroe* but which were not subsequently earned, the sum of \pounds 15,000 has been paid over by the Greek Government to Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom by agreement through the offsetting of accounts, and that Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom consequently assign to the Greek Government their claim on the debtors.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the Greek Government, I have further to propose that this Note, together with Your Excellency's reply to that effect, should be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.

Note of 12 July 1957 from Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy to the Royal Hellenic Ministry for Foreign Affairs

THE BRITISH EMBASSY

Athens, July 12, 1957

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy presents its compliments to the Royal Hellenic Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to refer to its *Note Verbale* No. 71 of March 22 and to previous correspondence regarding the Diverted Cargoes settlement.

Subject to what follows, Her Majesty's Government are now prepared to pay, in final settlement, the sum of $\pounds 691,187$ 17s. 6d. in accordance with the enclosed schedule.¹ This figure, as the Ministry will observe, includes the item of $\pounds 10,659$, 12s. 4d., to which the Ministry had drawn the attention of Her Majesty's Embassy on April 30 last, in respect of coal supplied to the British Forces in Greece in 1946.

Her Majesty's Government are not prepared to modify their attitude, as described in the Embassy's Note Verbale No. 71 of March 22, over the claim of the Anglo-Saxon Petroleum Company. Her Majesty's Government therefore wish to reaffirm that they are not willing to reduce their claim in respect of shipping from the figure of $\pounds 124,548$ which was accepted by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in April 1953 and is reproduced in the enclosed schedule.

As regards the question of British Underwriters' claim, which has also been mentioned during recent discussions, Her Majesty's Government are prepared to accept the offer made to Her Majesty's Embassy on April 30 last that the Ministry of Finance would support the introduction of the necessary special legislation to enable the underwriters to have further recourse to the Greek courts. This acceptance is subject to Her Majesty's Embassy receiving a written undertaking to this effect and also to it being clearly understood that the acceptance of this offer is without prejudice to Her Majesty's Government and the British Underwriters having the right, should they wish, to pursue the matter by any other means after the latter have had further recourse to the Greek courts.

Subject to the foregoing, Her Majesty's Government are ready to pay the Royal Hellenic Government the sum of $\pounds 691,187$ 17s. 6d. in respect of the Diverted Cargoes settlement simultaneously with the repayment by the Royal Hellenic Government of the $\pounds 2$ million which is now due in respect of the Currency Stabilisation Loan and which constitutes, as the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs will be aware, a binding treaty obligation of the Royal Hellenic Government.

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Royal Hellenic Ministry for Foreign Affairs the assurance of its highest consideration.
