Her Majesty's Ambassador at Belgrade to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia

Monsieur le Secrétaire d'État,

As Your Excellency will recall, the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia constituted by the Exchange of Notes of the 12th of April, 1960,2 as amended by the Exchange of Notes between the two Governments of the 24th of January/15th of February, 1961,3 relating to the import into Yugoslavia of British books, films and other material of an educational and cultural nature, and the acquisition of rights in such material, expired on the 12th of April, 1961. Thereafter, arrangements were made between the two Governments for the continuation of imports for the remainder of 1961 on the same terms as those contained in the Agreement.

I now have the honour to propose, under instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that a further Agreement in the same terms and employing the same rate of exchange as set out in the previous Agreement be concluded, this further Agreement to be regarded as having taken effect from the 1st of January, 1962, and as continuing in force for one year from that date unless terminated by either Government on two months' notice in writing to the other Government. If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Federal People's Republic of Yugoslavia I have also the honour to propose that this Note and your reply to that effect should constitute the said further Agreement between the two Governments in this matter.
