Subject: Application for admission to the United Nations

Sir,

The General Assembly of the United Nations having decided on 27 June 1962, on the proposal of the Belgian Government, to terminate, as from 1 July 1962,² the trusteeship under which the State of Burundi had been placed, Burundi acceded to full independence on that date.

Being desirous of discharging to the full the new responsibilities incumbent upon it at the international level and making its contribution to the activities of the United Nations community, the Government of Burundi has decided to apply without delay for the admission of the State of Burundi to membership in the United Nations.

I have the honour, therefore, on behalf of my Government and under the terms of Article 4 of the Charter of the United Nations, to request you to submit the application of the State of Burundi to the Security Council for its consideration with a view to obtaining the recommendation required for its inclusion in the agenda of the next session of the General Assembly.

The Government of the State of Burundi hereby declares that it accepts the obligations contained in the Charter of the United Nations and is able to carry them out. It solemnly undertakes to comply with them faithfully and conscientiously.

Accept, Sir, the assurance of my highest consideration.
