No. 6962. TREATY¹ OF FRIENDSHIP AND CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC AND THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA. SIGNED AT PRAGUE, ON 29 MAY 1961

The President of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic and the President of the Republic of Indonesia,

desiring further to develop and strengthen friendly relations and co-operation between the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic and the Republic of Indonesia on the basis of mutual respect for national sovereignty, non-interference into internal affairs, equality and mutual advantages,

firmly resolved to contribute to the relaxation of international tension, the establishment of confidence among States and the development of international cooperation,

being convinced that further strengthening and development of friendly relations and mutual co-operation between Czechoslovakia and Indonesia is in harmony with the interests of the people of the two countries,

desiring to implement in their mutual relations the purposes and principles of the United Nations and the Resolution of the XIIIth United Nations General Assembly Session on Measures Aimed at the Implementation and Promotion of Peaceful and Neighbourly Relations among States,

decided to conclude the present Treaty of Friendship and Co-operation :

Article 1

Both Contracting Parties solemnly declare that both States shall take part in all international actions aimed at the safeguarding of world peace and security, the promotion of peaceful co-operation and complete liquidation of colonialism and imperialism in all their manifestations, and which are consistent with the purposes and principles of the United Nations Charter.

Article 2

Both Contracting Parties shall exchange views on important international questions of interest to the two Parties.

Article 3

The Contracting Parties undertake to develop their relations and mutual co-operation on the basis of mutual respect for sovereignty and non-interference into internal affairs, equality and mutual advantages.

Article 4

The Contracting Parties have decided to settle all differences which might arise between them exclusively by peaceful means and in conformity with the provisions of the United Nations Charter.

Article 5

The Contracting Parties are convinced that mutually beneficial economic co-operation constitutes a firm basis of their peaceful and friendly relations and, therefore, undertake to continue to foster this co-operation in the interest of construction and development in their respective countries.

Article 6

Both Contracting Parties have agreed further to develop and promote mutual relations in the field of education, culture, science and technology and thus contribute to deeper understanding between the peoples of the two countries in the interest of the broadest possible knowledge of their respective cultural heritage and of the constant advancement of technical standards of their respective economies.

Article 7

1. The present Treaty is subject to ratification and shall become effective on the day of exchange of the instruments of ratification which will take place in Djakarta within the shortest possible time.

2. The present Treaty is concluded for an indefinite period of time and shall remain valid unless denounced in writing by either Contracting Party twelve months in advance.

DONE in Prague on May 29, 1961, in duplicate, in the Czech, Indonesian and English languages, all of these texts being equally authentic.
