No 7334 AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF TOGO RELATING TO A SEMINAR UNITED NATIONS ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN IN FAMILY LAW. SIGNED AT LOMÉ. ON 3 JULY 1964

The United Nations and the Government of Togo (hereinafter called "the Government"), desiring to give effect to the provisions of General Assembly resolution 926 $(X)^2$ concerning the programme of advisory services in human rights have agreed as follows :

Article I

SEMINAR ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN IN FAMILY LAW

1. A United Nations seminar on the status of women in family law will be held at Lomé, Togo'.

The duration of the seminar shall be from 18 to 31 August 1964 inclusive. 2.

The purpose of the seminar shall be to provide an opportunity for an exchange of 3. experience and information concerning the status of women in family law.

Article II

PARTICIPATION IN THE SEMINAR

Participation in the seminar shall be open to :

(a) National participants and alternates nominated by the Governments of countries which are members of the Economic Commission for Africa. A Chairman shall be elected by the national participants from among themselves to preside at the seminar. Vice-chairmen and rapporteurs shall also be elected in the same manner;

(b) Observers from other States Members of the United Nations;

(c) Representatives from any specialized agencies of the United Nations which may be invited by the United Nations to send representatives;

(d) Observers from non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council which may be invited by the United Nations to send observers;

(e) Members of the United Nations Secretariat.

Article III

Services to be provided by the United Nations

1. The United Nations shall provide the following services in connexion with the seminar :

- (a) The services of the members of the United Nations Secretariat mentioned in article II (e) above;
- (b) The preparation of background working papers which will be used as the basis for discussions at the seminar;
- (c) The translation of the background working papers into English and French;
- (d) The preparation of the draft report of the seminar and the reproduction and distribution of the final report following its approval by the seminar.
- 2. The United Nations shall defray the following costs in connexion with the seminar:
 - (a) The travel expenses and subsistence allowances of not more than one participant from each of the participating countries (see article II (a) above), with the exception of the host country;
 - (b) The services of simultaneous interpreters for interpretation into and from English and French;
 - (c) The equipment for simultaneous interpretation ;
 - (d) The services of secretaries qualified to take down dictation in English and, where necessary, in French.

Article IV

CO-OPERATION OF THE GOVERNMENT IN THE SEMINAR

1. The Government shall act as host to the seminar.

2. The Government shall nominate an official as liaison officer and one or more assistant liaison officers between the United Nations and the Government who shall be responsible for making the necessary arrangements concerning the contributions of the Government described in paragraph 3 below.

- 3. The Government shall provide and defray the costs of :
 - (a) Adequately furnished and equipped premises in which the seminar will meet and the maintenance of the said premises during the seminar;

- (b) Office accommodation for the officers and staff of the seminar;
- (c) Amplification equipment for the conference room;
- (d) Postal, telegraph and telephone facilities connecting with Togo territory, for official work in connexion with the seminar;
- (e) The services of translators to make the translation of the final report of the seminar into French;
- (f) The mimeographed reproduction of the seminar report in the above-mentioned languages and the reproduction of such working papers as may be required during the seminar;
- (g) The services of a technician to operate and maintain the simultaneous interpretation equipment;
- (h) The services of a secretary qualified to take dictation in French, also of typists;
- (i) The services of a person responsible for the reproduction and distribution of the seminar documents, also of one assistant;
- (j) The use of automobiles for transporting the participants from their hotels to the conference room and back ;
- (k) The services of a protocol staff which shall be responsible for meeting all the participants at the airport, assisting them through Customs and Immigration formalities and taking them to their hotels.

Article V

FACILITIES, PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES

1. The Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations¹ shall be applicable to the seminar. Accordingly, officials of the United Nations performing functions in connexion with the seminar shall enjoy the privileges and immunities provided under articles V and VII of the said Convention.

2. Officials of the specialized agencies attending the seminar in pursuance of paragraph (c) of article II of this Agreement shall be accorded the privileges and immunities

provided under articles VI and VIII of the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the specialized agencies.¹

Without prejudice to the provisions of the Convention on the Privileges and 3. Immunities of the United Nations, all participants and all persons performing functions in connexion with the seminar shall enjoy such privileges and immunities, facilities and courtesies as are necessary for the independent exercise of their functions in connexion with the seminar.

4. All participants and all persons performing functions in connexion with the seminar, who are not nationals of Togo, shall have the right of entry into and exit from Togo. They shall be granted facilities for speedy travel. Visas, where required, shall be granted free of charge.

Article VI

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. This Agreement shall come into force upon signature, or, if it is not signed on the same day on behalf of both Parties, on the day on which the second signature is affixed.

This Agreement may be modified by written agreement between the United 2. Nations and the Government.
