Dear Mr. Hewitt :

I refer to recent discussions in Washington between representatives of the Government of the United States of America and of the Governments of Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom. These discussions concerned the payment for logistical support rendered by the United States to armed forces of Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom during the United Nations operations in Korea through June 30, 1958.

As a result of these discussions it is the understanding of the Government of the United States that the following agreements have been reached for the logistical support concerned :

1. The governments agree that the amount due the Government of the United States for Korean logistical support as adjusted for various credits due the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand is \$45,400,737. A detailed statement of account² will be rendered accordingly by the United States Government and will then form a part of this agreement.

2. Payment of the amount set out in paragraph 1 shall be due within thirty days from this date. Interest shall be due on the unpaid balance thereafter, computed at the

rate of 3-1/2 per cent compounded annually. Payment shall be made in United States dollars and shall be made no later than June 30, 1964.

3. Payment of the amount set forth in paragraph 1 plus any payment due under paragraph 2 shall constitute full payment for all logistical support rendered by the United States to armed forces of Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom for United Nations operations in Korea through June 30, 1958. No further payments from the Governments of Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and Canada will be requested by the Government of the United States for such logistical support furnished any of the British Commonwealth forces.

I should appreciate your confirming these understandings on behalf of the Governments of Australia, New Zealand and the United Kingdom.
