The Minister for External Affairs and Defence of the Republic of Tanganyika presents his compliments to the Ambassador of Israel and has the honour to refer to the conversations and correspondence which has taken place between representatives of the two Governments regarding visas for holders of diplomatic and service passports and to suggest that an agreement on the following terms be concluded :

1. The Government of Israel shall exempt holders of valid Tanganyika diplomatic and service passports from the obligation to obtain a visa for the purpose of entering or leaving Israel.

2. The Government of Tanganyika shall exempt holders of valid Israel diplomatic and service passports from the obligation to obtain a visa for the purpose of entering or leaving Tanganyika.

3. Holders of Israel diplomatic and service passports exercising official functions in Tanganyika or whose stay there exceeds the period of three months, shall apply in Tanganyika for the usual permits of residence.

4. Holders of Tanganyikan diplomatic and service passports exercising official functions in Israel, or whose stay there exceeds the period of three months, shall apply in Israel for the usual permits of residence.

5. Service passports are passports issued by the Government of Israel to persons in the service of that Government for travel on official business. In regard to the Government of Tanganyika, all persons in the service of the Government of Tanganyika, while travelling on official business, shall be considered as bearers of service passports.

6. This Agreement may at any time be terminated by either Government giving an advance notice of six months of its intention to do so, to the other.

Should the above proposals prove acceptable to the Government of Israel, the Minister has the honour to propose that this note and the reply of the Ambassador thereto shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments which will enter into force on the date of the Ambassador's note in reply.

The Minister for External Affairs and Defence avails himself of this opportunity to renew to the Ambassador of Israel the assurances of his highest consideration.
