SIGNED AT LEOPOLDVILLE, ON 27 JANUARY 1964

(c) AGREEMENT¹ REGARDING THE DATES OF TERMINATION OF THE HAND-OVER OPERATIONS OF KAMINA AND KITONA BASES AND THE CESSATION OF ONUC RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THOSE BASES AND THEIR PERSONNEL. SIGNED AT LEOPOLDVILLE, ON 15 FEBRUARY 1964

Having regard to the arrangements concluded on 23 and 27 January 1964² between the delegations of ONUC, the Belgian Government and the Congolese Government to enable the operations for the take-over and transfer of the Kamina and Bas-Congo to begin before the exchanges of letters³ which are to establish the procedures for those operations ;

Whereas the operations for the take-over and transfer of those bases were completed in respect of the Bas-Congo on 6 February 1964 and in respect of Kamina on 13 February 1964 ;

In accordance moreover with the intentions of the different parties, as expressed on various occasions during the meetings of the tripartite commission and as embodied in the draft agreement and the draft exchanges of letters, the three delegations declare that on the above-mentioned dates the United Nations in the Congo ceased the administration of the bases and their personnel and the Government of the Congo assumed responsibility for their administration.
