Vessels and their cargoes of either party shall receive at the Ports of the other Party the same concessions etc. which are granted by that Party to its own Commercial vessels as regards port dues, charges and other facilities.

#### *Article IV*

The advantages set out in Article III above of this agreement shall not apply to :

- (i) Preferences which either of the two countries grants to facilitate frontier traffic;
- (ii) Advantages resulting from a customs union which either of the two Contracting Parties had previously concluded or shall conclude, or resulting from a free exchange system as in the cases of the Free Trade Area;
- (iii) Preferences and advantages permitted by GATT, <sup>1</sup>particularly those covered by Article I and paragraph II of Article XXIV of GATT.

#### *Article V*

The two Governments agree that the exchange of commodities and goods between the two countries, unless otherwise agreed between them, shall be through normal trade channels.

#### *Article VI*

Subject to the laws and regulations in force in either country, the two Governments agree to grant all facilities necessary for the promotion of trade between the two countries.

#### *Article VII*

Both Parties agree to consult each other whenever necessary in order to recommend measures for expanding mutual trade or to overcome any difficulties that might arise in connection with fulfilment of this agreement.

#### *Article VIII*

Payments and other charges in connection with the import and export of commodities and goods as well as other payments between the two countries shall be made or discharged in transferable pounds sterling unless otherwise agreed to by the Governments of the two countries.

*Article IX*

This agreement shall come into force with effect from the date of its signature and shall remain in force for a period of one year. It will be automatically renewed from year to year unless in any agreement year notice is given by either Party, three months before the date of its expiry.

DONE at Athens in duplicate, in English, both documents being equally authentic, on this seventeenth day of January 1963.
