EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE ORGANISATIONS PARTICIPATING IN THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME AND SINGAPORE CONCERNING THE ASSUMPTION BY THE GOVERNMENT OF SINGAPORE OF THE OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE AGREEMENT SIGNED AT KUALA LUMPUR ON 21 MAY 1959, AND AT BANGKOK ON 29 MAY 1959,² FOR THE PROVISION OF OPERATIONAL AND EXECUTIVE PERSONNEL, AND THE STANDARD AGREEMENT CONCERNING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, SIGNED AT KUALA LUMPUR ON 1 MARCH 1962.³ SINGAPORE, 13 DECEMBER 1965, AND KUALA LUMPUR, 31 DECEMBER 1965

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Government of Singapore accepts the provisions of the Agreement between the United Nations and the Government of Malaysia for the provision of Operational and Executive Personnel, signed at Kuala Lumpur on 21 May 1959 and at Bangkok on 29 May 1959.² The Government of Singapore likewise accepts the provisions of the Agreement between the Organizations participating in the United Nations expanded programme of technical assistance and the Government of Malaysia, signed at Kuala Lumpur on 1 March 1962.³ For this purpose, the Government is willing to consider itself as the successor to Malaysia with respect to projects and operations in Singapore under those two Agreements.

Accordingly, for all projects and operations currently under execution in Singapore under the United Nations programme for the provision of operational and executive personnel as well as under the United Nations expanded programme of technical assistance the Government of Singapore will apply the provisions of the agreements referred to above, and it will likewise apply them to projects and operations which may be approved in the future.

This arrangement will apply until such time as agreements relating to the two programmes under reference are signed by the Government of Singapore and the United Nations and other Organizations participating in the expanded programme of technical assistance and come into force.
