No. 8835. PROTOCOL¹ BETWEEN THE KINGDOM GREECE AND THE KINGDOM OF NORWAY CON-CERNING THE RECIPROCAL GRANT OF **IMPORT** AND EXPORT LICENCES WITH MOST-FAVOURED-NATION TREATMENT. SIGNED AT ATHENS, ON **25 SEPTEMBER 1964**

As a result of negotiations between the Embassy of the Kingdom of Norway and the Royal Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the following agreement has been reached:

- The Trade Agreement of 12 March 19492 shall be regarded as having expired.
- The two Contracting Parties shall grant each other most-favoured-nation treatment in the reciprocal issue of import and export licences.
- (a) The yearly quotas for imports of Greek products into Norway shall be as follows:
 - (1) Wine and other alcoholic beverages 500,000
 - (2) Fresh fruit, including apples and pears Kr. 1,000,000

Import licences for fresh fruit shall be granted in accordance with the provisions of the Norwegian agricultural agreement now in force.

(b) The competent Greek authorities undertake to grant export licences to Norway for 35,000 tons of bauxite annually.

This Protocol shall enter into force on 1 January 1965. It shall remain in force until 31 December 1965 and shall be extended from year to year by tacit agreement unless either of the Contracting Parties gives three months' notice of termination.
