## AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF DEN-MARK AND THE GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN ON TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION

The Government of Denmark and the Government of Pakistan, desirous of strengthening the friendly relations between the two countries and their peoples, and recognizing their mutual interest in the economic and technical development of their countries, have agreed as follows:

#### Article 1

The Government of Denmark and the Government of Pakistan shall endeavour, through co-operation over a period of two years, to develop producer cooperatives in the production field in the Comilla area, East Pakistan.

The purposes of these endeavours are to involve a larger part of the population in co-operative work and to expand efforts on the production and marketing sides as indicated below.

#### Article 2

The Government of Denmark will make available for the project the following machinery and equipment at a maximum value of Danish kroner 893,000, c.i.f. nearest East Pakistan port:

### (a) Poultry field

Incubator, capacity 15,000 eggs Annual supply of 100 cocks for breeding Slaughter-house and packing equipment Packing material for deep-frozen chickens Hammer mill for chicken feed

### (b) Dairy field

Refrigerator tanks for collecting centres Butter and cheese packing material 100 milk cans Equipment for 3-4 wholesale centres 2 trucks with refrigerator equipment Refrigerator equipment for 20 retail stores Miscellaneous ancillary equipment

### (c) One electric generator

The Kotwali Thana Central Co-operative Association (KTCCA) will pay import duty and taxes on the aforementioned equipment and cover the cost of its transportation in Pakistan.

### Article 3

The Government of Denmark will donate the machinery and equipment referred to in Article 2 to a Trust Fund to be established by the KTCCA for the purpose of financing and administering the training of a group of Pakistani managers to be in charge of the units of the co-operative movement in East Pakistan. In addition, the Fund shall take up other training activities for the co-operative movement.

The capital of the Fund shall be provided by the KTCCA as payment for the aforementioned Danish equipment. The Fund may accept contributions from other sources.

The Fund shall be an independent institution. It shall be governed by a Board of four members. The members of the Board, including the chairman, shall be appointed by the Government of Pakistan, provided that the Consul of Denmark at Karachi shall sit on the Board as long as this Agreement is in force. The members of the Board shall be appointed for the period of validity of this Agreement, which starts on the day of its signature. If a member retires within his term of office, the Government of Pakistan shall appoint a new member in his place.

The Board shall be responsible for the planning and management of the Fund. The Board shall decide its own rules of procedure. Its decisions shall be by majority of the votes cast. In the event of a tie vote the Chairman shall have the casting vote.

#### Article 4

The Government of Denmark will endeavour to make available, for a period of two years, four qualified experts having special experience in poultry farming, dairying, marketing and mechanical engineering.

The Kingdom of Denmark will cover the expenses of the travels of the four experts to and from Pakistan, their salaries and other emoluments during their stay in Pakistan.

The Government of Denmark will pay board and lodging for the experts while travelling on official business.

### Article 5

The KTCCA will cover the cost of transportation of the experts while travelling on official business.

### Article 6

The Government of Pakistan will accord privileges to the Danish experts and their families in accordance with the standard rules laid down by the Government of Pakistan for foreign technical assistance experts.

Any income which falls within the description of salary, and which is received by or due to the Danish experts from the Government of Denmark shall be exempt from income tax in Pakistan.

#### Article 7

This Agreement shall enter into force on the day of its signature.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, being duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed this Agreement.
