# AGREEMENT 1 BETWEEN THE ROYAL THAI GOVERN-MENT AND THE ROYAL DANISH GOVERNMENT CONCERNING TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION ON SILVI-CULTURE AND GENETICS OF CONIFERS

# Preamble

The Royal Thai Government and the Royal Danish Government,

Desirous of strengthening the friendly relations between the two countries and their peoples, and

Recognizing their mutual interest in the economic and technical development of their countries,

Have agreed as follows:

### Article 1

The object of co-operation under this Agreement is to promote the silvicultural and genetic research of local and introduced conifers and of other tree species suitable for the pulp and paper industry, and to ensure a continuous and improved regeneration of local pines for the same purpose.

# Article 2

The Thai Government will provide a suitable site for an experimental station and nursery. An area of 25 hectares, near the station, and another 150 hectares for later extensions near the station will likewise be made available by the Thai Government. Furthermore the Thai Government will provide suitable test areas in connection with already existing sub-stations at Lampao-Lomsai (Kanchanaburi), Suratthani, and Sisaket. The Thai Government will be responsible for the cost of construction, furnishing, and maintenance of all buildings which both parties may deem it necessary to erect under the Project.

The Thai Government will bear all costs in connection with fencing, clearing, draining and levelling of the ground, as well as the costs in connection with the necessary road construction and the securing of water for consumption.

The Thai Government furthermore undertakes to make available at the nursery sufficient water to meet the requirements for artificial watering.

# Article 3

The Danish Government will provide and pay for one expert on forest genetics and an assistant to him. The Danish Government also undertakes to make available vehicles, necessary research and genetic equipment, implements and tools and to cover the operational expenses of the Project apart from those referred to in Articles 2 and 4 within an amount of Dan.kr. 985,000. Subject to Article 9 of this Agreement, the Danish expert will be in charge of daily operations during the Agreement.

# Article 4

The Thai Government will provide and pay for one or two foresters to serve with the Danish expert as co-workers and necessary forest rangers to serve as assistants at the experimental station and nursery.

The Thai Government will furthermore provide and pay for necessary local labour.

## Article 5

For further training in Denmark, the Danish Government will grant two or more fellowships to Thai nationals to be selected by the Thai authorities concerned in consultation with the project management. The fellowship will cover all costs in connection with the training in Denmark, such as travel to and from Denmark, tuition fees, insurance, board and lodging, and pocket money.

# Article 6

The Thai Government will allow importation free of duties and taxes

of machinery, implements, tools, materials and other goods to be used for the Project.

The Thai Government will accord to the Danish expert and assistant referred to in Article 3 such privileges as are customarily accorded by the Thai Government to similar experts under a technical co-operative project.

# Article 7

The common Project will be managed in a spirit of co-operation between the Danish expert and assistant and their Thai counterparts.

A commission of five members consisting of two Thai representatives, two Danish representatives and a chairman, nominated by the Thai Government, will be set up in Thailand to support and promote the Project. The commission will meet from time to time, at least once a year, to consider the broad aspect of the Project.

#### Article 8

Further details as to the contributions of the Thai Government and the Danish Government, and their respective responsibilities in connection with the establishment and operation of the Project may be stipulated later in a protocol to this Agreement.

#### Article 9

On the expiration of a period of five years, the Project may, by mutual consent, be extended for a period to be agreed upon. The vehicles, equipment and other supplies provided for the Project by the Danish Government will become the property of the Thai Government on the termination of this Agreement.

## Article 10

This Agreement will enter into force on the date of its signature.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed this Agreement.
