TRADE AGREEMENT ¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the French Republic, having regard to the Agreement concerning Reciprocal Trade Relations and the Status of the Trade Delegation of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in France, dated 3 September 1951², and desiring to develop trade between the two countries during the coming three years, have agreed as follows:

Article 1

Deliveries of goods from the USSR to France and from France to the USSR shall be carried out, during the period from 1 July 1953 to 1 July 1954, i.e. during the first twelve months of the effective period of this Agreement, in accordance with the quotas listed in schedules 1 and 2 annexed hereto and, during the two following years, in accordance with quotas which shall be agreed in good time between the competent authorities of the two Governments and set forth in special protocols for each year.

Schedule 2 also includes equipment for which the waiting period for delivery exceeds the twelve-month period referred to above.

Article 2

Each of the Governments undertakes to adopt all measures within its power to ensure the execution of the deliveries provided for in this Agreement. To that end, the competent authorities of the two Governments shall freely issue the necessary import and export licences for the goods specified in this Agreement.

Article 3

Deliveries of goods provided for in this Agreement shall be made on the basis of contracts to be concluded between Soviet foreign trade organizations and French individuals and bodies corporate.

The two Governments shall facilitate the conclusion of such contracts in the briefest possible time, particularly contracts concerning equipment for which the waiting period for delivery exceeds the twelve-month period referred to in article 1.

Article 4

Soviet goods and French goods not specified in schedules 1 and 2, or goods for which the quotas have been filled, may also be traded.

The competent authorities of the two Governments shall give most favourable consideration to the issue of import and export licences for such goods.

Article 5

All payments under this Agreement shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Payments Agreement between the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the French Republic, signed on today's date.

The amounts of all payments by each of the Parties under this Agreement shall be kept in approximate balance, and such balance shall be realized at six-month intervals during the effective period of this Agreement.

Article 6

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the French Republic shall appoint their representatives, who shall meet at six-month intervals, alternately in Moscow and Paris, to supervise the application of this Agreement and of the Payments Agreement signed on today's date, and evolve measures to ensure the proper application of those Agreements.

Article 7

The portion of the price of the French goods listed in schedule 2 for delivery in 1954-1955 which is not offset by deliveries of Soviet goods from those enumerated in schedule 1 shall be paid, by agreement between the Parties, from the proceeds of the sale in France of cereals, anthracite, pitch coal, furs, timber, chrome and manganese ore, asbestos and other goods.

Article 8

This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signature and shall remain in force for a term of three years.

Unless one of the Parties gives written notification, six months before the expiry of the above-mentioned three-year term, of its desire to denounce the Agreement, it shall remain in force until one of the Parties denounces it on six months' notice.

After the termination of this Agreement, its provisions shall continue to be applied until all obligations arising from any transactions concluded during the effective period of the Agreement have been finally settled.

DONE at Paris, on 15 July 1953, in two copies, each in the Russian and French languages, both texts being equally authentic.
