## EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREE-MENT<sup>1</sup> BETWEEN FRANCE AND MONACO CONCERN-ING CO-ORDINATED ACTION IN TOWN PLANNING

Paris, 18 May 1963

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that, in view of the town planning problems caused by the proximity and, in certain cases, intersecting of buildings across the Franco-Monegasque border, the Government of the French Republic considers that co-ordinated action by the two States is required in town planning. To that end, my Government proposes that the competent authorities of the two countries should consult each other before drawing up or modifying town planning schemes involving the French communes of Cap d'Ail, la Turbie, Beausoleil and Roquebrune and the texts of laws and regulations pertaining to the Monegasque border area.

I should be grateful if you would inform me whether this proposal meets with the agreement of the Government of the Principality.
