LONG-TERM TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BENE-LUX ECONOMIC UNION AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC. SIGNED AT WARSAW ON 22 AUGUST 1967

The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, and

The Government of the Kingdom of Belgium acting, by virtue of existing agreements, both on its own behalf and on behalf of the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg,

These Governments acting jointly by virtue of the Treaty instituting the Benelux Economic Union, signed at The Hague, on 3 February 1958,² being the Contracting Party of the one part, and

The Government of the Polish People's Republic, being the Contracting Party of the other part,

Prompted by the desire to promote trade between their territories to the greatest possible extent and in accordance with the domestic regulations in force,

Considering that existing conditions are conducive to a more intensive development of economic relations between the Benelux Economic Union and the Polish People's Republic,

Desiring to continue their efforts to achieve the greatest possible liberalization in trade between their territories,

Have agreed as follows:

Article I

For the purposes of this Agreement, Netherlands, Belgian and Luxembourg goods shall be deemed to be those originating in the Benelux Economic Union.

Polish goods shall be deemed to be those originating in the Polish People's Republic.

Article II

The goods to be traded between the territories of the Contracting Parties under this Agreement and their treatment are specified in the annexed Protocols.

Article III

Within the context of their respective regulations, the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties shall adopt all appropriate measures to facilitate the harmonious utilization of the trade possibilities provided for in this Agreement.

Article IV

The Contracting Parties affirm their willingness to execute this Agreement liberally, and shall accord to each other the most favourable treatment possible in the issue of import permits over and above the quotas established in the schedules in force, in accordance with their import policy and as far as the situation permits.

Article V

In order to promote trade between the territories of the Contracting Parties, goods imported for purposes of re-export shall not, in principle, be charged to the quotas, provided that the origin of the goods is not changed.

Domestic regulations in the countries of the Contracting Parties must be complied with.

Article VI

In the case of exchanges between the territories of the Contracting Parties under contracts relating to job work, which shall be authorized by the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties, the Parties shall not impose licence-issuing procedures or customs-clearing formalities less advantageous than those imposed by them on similar exchanges with other countries. The exchanges effected under such contracts shall not, in principle, be charged to the quotas in force.

Article VII

The Contracting Parties express their readiness to foster under this Agreement the development of economic, industrial and technical co-operation between enterprises established in their respective territories.

Article VIII

Payments relating to trade between the territories of the Contracting Parties shall be settled in accordance with the provisions of the Payments Agreement in force between the Benelux countries and the Polish Republic.

Article IX

The Contracting Parties agree to pursue a policy of non-discrimination in the matter of international shipping.

To that end, the Governments of the Contracting Parties agree to refrain from any action detrimental to the shipping of the other Party.

Article X

A Joint Commission, composed of representatives of the Governments concerned, shall meet every year, at The Hague and at Warsaw alternately; it may also be convened whenever either of the Contracting Parties so requests.

The Joint Commission shall be empowered to submit to the Contracting Parties any proposals for furthering the development of trade between their territories and to consider any questions which may arise during the implementation of this Agreement.

In the event that the Joint Commission is convened to discuss the situation referred to in Protocol I, its competence shall be determined in accordance with the said Protocol.

Article XI

Either of the Contracting Parties may propose the opening of negotiations to review the Agreement for the purpose of making any pertinent amendments thereto. In the event that such negotiations, which shall be conducted with a view to securing equal benefits for both Contracting Parties, produce no positive results within the twelve months following the date of notification of the review, the Agreement shall be deemed to be abrogated.

Article XII

This Agreement shall be ratified or approved, in accordance with the domestic regulations in force in the respective countries. The instruments of ratification or approval shall be deposited with the Government of the Polish People's Republic as soon as possible.

Article XIII

In the case of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, this Agreement shall apply to the whole of the Kingdom unless otherwise provided in the Netherlands instrument of ratification.

Article XIV

This Agreement shall be valid for a period of three years and shall enter into force on the date of the deposit of the last instrument of ratification or approval, with retroactive effect from 1 January 1967.

It shall be considered to be renewed for one year by tacit consent after 31 December 1969, if neither of the Contracting Parties denounces it in writing three months before the expiry of the period of validity.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned, being duly authorized thereto, have signed this Agreement.

PROTOCOL I

ANNEXED TO THE LONG-TERM TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BENELUX ECONOMIC UNION AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC SIGNED AT WARSAW ON 22 AUGUST 1967

During the discussions which have led to the conclusion of the Long-Term Trade Agreement,

- 1. The Delegation of the Benelux Economic Union informed the Polish Party that the competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union had decided to authorize the importation, without quantitative restriction, of the products of Polish origin listed in schedule P1 annexed to this Protocol, beginning on the date of the entry into force of the above-mentioned Trade Agreement.
- 2. If the said authorities consider it necessary to amend this schedule, they shall immediately so inform the competent authorities of the Polish People's Republic. If the Polish Party expresses the desire, the Joint Commission shall meet forthwith in order to discuss the situation.
- 3. The Polish Delegation stated that, failing a satisfactory solution, the Polish Party reserved its right to make appropriate and equivalent amendments to schedule B annexed to Protocol II.

This Protocol shall form an integral part of the Long-Term Trade Agreement. Done at Warsaw, on 22 August 1967, in triplicate in the French language.

PROTOCOL II

ANNEXED TO THE LONG-TERM TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BENELUX ECONOMIC UNION AND THE POLISH PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC SIGNED AT WARSAW ON 22 AUGUST 1967

During the discussions which have led to the conclusion of the Long-Term Trade Agreement, the Contracting Parties agreed as follows:

1. Quota schedules P 2 and B annexed to this Protocol shall be valid for a period of one year beginning 1 January 1967.

In the event that new P 2 and B schedules are not prepared for each subsequent year of validity of the Long-Term Trade Agreement, the existing annual schedules shall be deemed to be renewed for a period of one year by tacit consent, if neither of the Contracting Parties denounces them two months before the expiry of the period of validity.

2. The competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union shall authorize the importation into the Benelux Economic Union of the Polish products specified in schedule P 2 at least in the quantities or up to the values specified for each of them.

For their part, the competent authorities of the Polish People's Republic shall authorize the exportation to the Benelux Economic Union of the said products at least in the quantities or up to the values specified for each of them.

3. The competent authorities of the Polish People's Republic shall authorize the importation into Poland of Netherlands, Belgian or Luxembourg products specified in schedule B at least in the quantities or up to the values specified for each of them.

For their part, the competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union shall authorize the exportation to the Polish People's Republic of the said products at least in the quantities or up to the values specified for each of them.

- 4. The Joint Commission shall be empowered to propose for each subsequent year of validity of the Long-Term Trade Agreement any desired amendments to schedules P 2 and B annexed hereto.
- 5. The competent authorities of the Contracting Parties make the following undertakings regarding certain quotas specified in schedules P 2 and B annexed to this Protocol:

SCHEDULE P 2

Item No. 4. Sheep for slaughter and meat of sheep:

The authorities of the Benelux Economic Union inform the competent authorities of the Polish People's Republic that imports under the quota established for these products must in principle take place between 1 January and 31 August.

If the domestic market situation develops favourably, the authorities of the Benelux Economic Union will accord sympathetic consideration to the possibility of authorizing the importation of these products also between 1 September and 31 December.

Item No. 6. Meat of horses, fresh, chilled or frozen, excluding meat of foals:

The authorities of the Belgo-Luxembourg Economic Union authorize the importation of these products in a quantity of 1,000 tons.

The authorities of the Kingdom of the Netherlands authorize the importation of these products in a quantity of 250 tons.

Item No. 10. Chicory root, dried:

The authorities of the Belgo-Luxembourg Economic Union authorize the importation of 3,150 tons of dried chicory root originating in Poland, for re-export after processing.

If the domestic market situation develops favourably, they will authorize, under the quota established for this product, importation for domestic consumption.

Item No. 11. Hops:

The authorities of the Belgo-Luxembourg Economic Union authorize the importation of hops originating in Poland, without discrimination, under the global quota established for this product.

Item No. 14. Dyestuffs:

In addition to the quota of 2 million Belgian francs the competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union undertake to issue licences for the importation of dyestuffs originating in Poland to a value of 10 million Belgian francs for reciprocal transactions relating exclusively to trade in dyestuffs.

Item No. 16. Cement:

The competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union are prepared to authorize the importation of cement originating in Poland under the limited quota established for the importation of this product.

They will nevertheless encourage the importation of Polish cement in a quantity of up to 35,000 tons for the year 1967.

Item No. 23. Iron and steel products:

The delegation of the Benelux Economic Union is prepared to accept the inclusion in schedule P 2 of a single quota for "Iron and steel products" of 31,000 tons, provided that the import licences are issued in the following way:

Item No. 31. Footwear, of leather:

The competent authorities of the Benelux Economic Union will consider the possibility of authorizing the importation of halfboots under this quota.

The competent authorities of the Polish People's Republic undertake to issue licences for the importation of dyestuffs originating in the Benelux Economic Union to a value of 10 million Belgian francs for reciprocal transactions relating exclusively to trade in dyestuffs.

6. The competent authorities of the Kingdom of the Netherlands authorize for the year 1967 the importation of 10,000 tons of sugar originating in Poland, exclusively for re-export after processing.

This Protocol shall form an integral part of the Long-Term Trade Agreement. Done at Warsaw, on 22 August 1967, in triplicate in the French language.

- 2. I am pleased to inform you, however, that the competent authorities of the Kingdom of the Netherlands have agreed:
- (a) to authorize for the year 1967 the importation of a minimum quantity of 175,000 tons of Polish coal;
- (b) should currently unforeseeable circumstances produce an improvement in the situation with regard to coal imports from third countries, to authorize during that year additional imports of Polish coal to the extent that the market situation permits.
