#### EXCHANGE OF LETTERS <sup>1</sup> CONSTITUTING AN AGREE-MENT ON FILM CO-PRODUCTION BETWEEN FRANCE AND ITALY

#### THE MINISTER FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS

22/CM Sir, Paris, 16 February 1970

At its meeting on 15 December 1969 in Paris, the Joint Commission provided for in the Franco-Italian Agreement on film co-production of 1 August 1966 <sup>2</sup> noted that the application of the said Agreement had given rise to a situation of substantial inequality to the detriment of Italy.

The two delegations considered ways of correcting that situation. In application of article 14 of the Agreement, they agreed to submit relevant proposals to their respective Governments for approval.

I have the honour to inform you that, with a view to restoring a situation of equality with regard to co-production films and transfers relating to such films, the Government of the French Republic has decided, as an exceptional measure, to grant the privileges reserved for co-production films to certain films of Italian national origin.

I suggest, moreover, that the competent authorities of the two countries should determine the number of such films.

If this solution meets with the approval of the Italian Government, I propose that this letter and your reply should constitute an agreement between our two Governments, such agreement to enter into force on the date of the second communication and to remain in force until 31 December 1971.
