Excellency:

I have the honor to refer to the Note from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs dated March 21, 1970* and to subsequent discussions between representatives of our two Governments regarding the extensions of the loans of the naval vessels ex-USS *Pecatonica* (AOG-57) and ex-USS *Whitemarsh* (LSD-8).

The loans of these two vessels were made pursuant to agreements between the Government of the United States and the Government of the Republic of China, effected by the exchange of notes signed on January 18, 1961,² the exchange of notes signed on June 8, 1961,³ the exchange of notes signed on February 7, 1959,⁴ and the exchange of notes signed on January 16 and March 6, 1967.⁵

I now have the honor to inform Your Excellency that, in response to the request of the Government of the Republic of China, the Government of the United States agrees to extend the loans of these vessels for an additional period of five years commencing from their respective expiration dates under the same terms and conditions of the agreements pertaining to these vessels referred to above. The five-year extension of the loans of these vessels is in addition to the periods previously agreed as computed from the respective dates of delivery

of these vessels. Accordingly, the next expiration dates of these vessels will be as follows:

Name of Vessel	Expiration Date
ex-USS Whitemarsh (LSD-8)	. November 17, 1975
ex-USS Pecatonica (AOG-57)	. April 22, 1976

If the foregoing is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of China, I have the honor further to propose that Your Excellency's reply to that effect and my note shall together constitute an agreement between our two Governments regarding this matter, which shall enter into force on the date of Your Excellency's reply.
