EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREE-MENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF NEW ZEALAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF WESTERN SAMOA CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF FINAN-CIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW LEGISLATIVE BUILDING, AND FOR THE ASAU HARBOUR PROJECT

My dear Minister,

I refer to discussions which have taken place between representatives of our respective Governments concerning the grant of loans by the Government of New Zealand to the Government of Western Samoa. I now propose on behalf of the Government of New Zealand that an agreement be reached between our two Governments in the following terms:

- 1. The Government of New Zealand will advance to the Government of Western Samoa a loan, which will be a charge upon the public revenues of Western Samoa, of the sum of \$150,000 in New Zealand currency to be applied by the Government of Western Samoa towards the cost of the construction of a new legislative assembly building (Maoto Fono) for Western Samoa. The Government of New Zealand welcomes the assurance of the Government of Western Samoa that New Zealand materials will be used wherever economically feasible in the construction thereof.
- 2. The Government of New Zealand will advance to the Government of Western Samoa a loan, which will be a charge upon the public revenues of Western Samoa, of the sum of \$150,000 in New Zealand currency to be applied by the Government of Western Samoa towards the cost of the Asau Harbour Project.
- 3. The terms of the loans described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be 20 years and repayment in each case shall be by 15 equal annual instalments paid by the Government of Western Samoa to the Government of New Zealand in New Zealand currency commencing at the expiration of 5 years from the date on which each loan, or any part thereof, is advanced by the Government of New Zealand to the Government of Western Samoa.

- 4. Interest on the loans described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above shall be paid by the Government of Western Samoa to the Government of New Zealand in New Zealand currency and calculated in each case at the rate of $5\frac{1}{2}$ percent per annum on the reducing nominal balance rebated to 1 percent per annum for the first 3 years. Interest shall be calculated as if the sum advanced in the case of each loan were \$130,735, reducing by equal annual amounts of \$8,715.67 over the final 15 years of the loan.
- 5. Representatives of New Zealand and the Government of Western Samoa will settle to the satisfaction of both Governments, such further terms and arrangements as may be necessary to give effect to this Agreement.

If the foregoing provisions are acceptable to the Government of Western Samoa I have the honour to suggest that the present letter and your reply in similar terms should constitute an agreement between our two Governments.
