Note No. 2

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy present their compliments to the Federal Ministry of Foreign Affairs and with reference to the Ministry's Note No. 200.642/71 of 10 February 1971 have the honour to propose, on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, that:

- (1) In article 12 of the Treaty between the United Kingdom and the Czechoslovak Republic for the Extradition of Criminals, signed at London on 11 November 1924,<sup>2</sup> as amended by the Protocol signed at London on 4 June 1926,<sup>2</sup> reference to "the Minister of Justice" shall be construed as if it were a reference to either the Minister of Justice of the Czech Socialist Republic or the Minister of Justice of the Slovak Socialist Republic.
- (2) In paragraph (1) of article 3 and in paragraph (3) of article 8 of the Convention between the United Kingdom and the Czechoslovak Republic relative to Legal Proceedings in Civil and Commercial Matters, signed at London on 11 November 1924, reference to the Ministry of Justice of the Czechoslovak Republic at Prague relative to either the Ministry of Justice of the Czech Socialist Republic at Prague or the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Socialist Republic at Bratislava.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to the Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, the Embassy have the honour to suggest that this Note and the Ministry's reply to that effect shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments regarding the implementation of the provisions of the said Treaty and Convention with effect from the date of the Ministry's reply.

The Embassy avail themselves of this opportunity to renew to the Federal Ministry of Foreign Affairs the assurances of their highest consideration.
