EXCHANGE OF NOTES CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KING-DOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE STATE OF AJMAN AND ITS DEPENDENCIES CONCERNING THE TERMI-NATION OF SPECIAL TREATY RELATIONS BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND AJMAN AND ITS DE-PENDENCIES

Her Majesty's Political Resident at Bahrain to His Highness the Ruler of Ajman and its Dependencies

1 December, 1971

Your Highness,

I have the honour to refer to the discussions which have taken place between Your Highness and myself concerning the termination of the special treaty relations between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the State of Ajman and its Dependencies and to the desire of Your Highness's Government that the State of Ajman should be a member of the United Arab Emirates which is about to be established and to assume full international responsibility as a sovereign and independent State. On behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom I now propose that :

- (1) The special treaty relations between the United Kingdom and the State of Ajman, which are inconsistent with membership of a Union which has full international responsibility as a sovereign and independent State, shall terminate with effect from today's date.
- (2) The Exclusive Agreement of 7 March 1892 and all other agreements, engagements, undertakings and arrangements between the United Kingdom and the State of Ajman flowing from the special treaty relations between the two States shall terminate with effect from the same date.
- (3) The relations between the United Kingdom and the State of Ajman as a member of the United Arab Emirates shall continue to be governed by a spirit of close friendship and co-operation in accordance with a treaty of friendship concerning the future relations between the United Kingdom and the United Arab Emirates.

If the foregoing proposals are acceptable to Your Highness's Government, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Highness's reply

to that effect, shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments in this matter which shall enter into force on today's date.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Highness the assurances of my highest consideration.
