LONG-TERM TRADE AGREEMENT<sup>1</sup> BETWEEN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC AND THE BENELUX ECONOMIC UNION

The Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, being the Contracting Party of the one part, and

The Government of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, and

The Government of the Kingdom of Belgium acting, by virtue of existing agreements, both on its own behalf and on behalf of the Government of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg,

These Governments acting jointly by virtue of the Treaty instituting the Benelux Economic Union, signed at The Hague, on 3 February 1958,<sup>2</sup> being the Contracting Party of the other part,

Desiring to develop the trade relations between their countries, on a basis of equality and mutual advantage, account being taken of the fact that they are parties to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade<sup>3</sup> and of their laws and regulations in force,

Have agreed as follows:

Article I. With a view to achieving the objectives laid down in this Agreement, the Contracting Parties shall be guided, in their trade with one another, by the provisions of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade.

Article II. The Governments of the Benelux countries shall pursue a policy of liberalization of imports with a view to the abolition, during the period of application of the Agreement, of such quantitative restrictions as still exist.

Article III. The Contracting Parties shall endeavour to ensure, during the period of validity of this Agreement, the development of their trade with one another in order to make maximum use of the opportunities provided by their economies.

Article IV. The authorities of the Contracting Parties shall continue to facilitate jobbing operations.

In the case of contracts relating to job work, the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties shall not impose licence-issuing procedures or customs-clearing formalities less advantageous than those imposed by them on similar transactions with other countries.

*Article V.* For the purposes of this Agreement, Netherlands, Belgian and Luxembourg goods shall be deemed to be those originating in the Benelux Economic Union; Czechoslovak goods shall be deemed to be those originating in the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic.

*Article VI.* The detailed provisions relating to reciprocal trade under this Agreement shall be set forth in annual protocols. The provisions for the year 1972 are contained in the "1972 Protocol" annexed to this Agreement.

The provisions relating to each consecutive year shall be adopted by the Contracting Parties on the basis of the work of the Mixed Commission provided for in article VII of this Agreement, account being taken of their desire to facilitate and increase trade from year to year during the period of validity of this Agreement.

*Article VII.* A Mixed Commission, composed of representatives of the two Governments, shall meet each year, alternately at The Hague and at Prague; it shall also meet at any time at the request of either Contracting Party.

The Mixed Commission shall be empowered to submit to the Contracting Parties any proposals for promoting the development of mutual trade and to consider any questions that may arise in the implementation of this Agreement.

It shall be empowered in particular to negotiate annual protocols concerning imports and exports, as provided for in article VI of this Agreement.

*Article VIII.* The Contracting Parties agree to engage, as in the past, in exchange of services.

*Article IX.* Payments relating to trade between the territories of the Contracting Parties shall be effected in accordance with the provisions of the payments agreement in force between the Benelux countries and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic.

*Article X.* This Agreement shall be ratified or approved by the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties, and the instruments of ratification or approval shall be deposited with the Government of the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic as soon as possible.

*Article XI.* In the case of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, this Agreement shall apply to the whole Kingdom, unless otherwise provided in the Netherlands instrument of ratification.

*Article XII.* This Agreement, which shall supersede the Trade Agreement signed at Prague on 15 November 1967<sup>1</sup> shall be valid for a period of three years and shall enter into force on the date of deposit of the last instrument of ratification or approval, with retroactive effect from 1 January 1972.

The Contracting Parties reserve the right to engage in consultations pursuant to their international commitments, but such consultations shall not call in question the fundamental objectives of the Agreement.

DECLARATION BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE DELEGATION  
OF THE BENELUX ECONOMIC UNION

During the negotiations which led, this day, to the initialling of the long-term Trade Agreement between the Benelux Economic Union and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, the Governments of the Benelux countries expressed their intention of pursuing a policy of liberalization of imports with the aim of abolishing, during the period of application of the said Agreement, such quantitative restrictions as still exist. However, they cannot rule out the possibility that, by way of exception, certain restrictions may have to be maintained beyond that period for special reasons.

If such should be the case, the Governments of the Benelux countries are prepared to consult on the subject within the framework of the Mixed Commission.

“1972 PROTOCOL”

ANNEXED TO THE LONG-TERM TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC AND THE BENELUX ECONOMIC UNION SIGNED AT THE HAGUE ON 6 APRIL 1972

During the negotiations which led to the conclusion of the long-term Trade Agreement, the Contracting Parties, referring to article VI of the said Agreement, agreed as follows:

*Article I.* (1) The Contracting Parties have drawn up schedule A (Imports of Czechoslovak products into the Benelux Economic Union) and schedule B (Imports of Benelux Economic Union products into Czechoslovakia) annexed hereto.

(2) Where a licence is required, the competent authorities of the Contracting Parties shall as speedily as possible issue a licence for the import or export, as the case may be, of products listed in schedules A and B, at least up to the quantity or value indicated for each product.

(3) The Contracting Parties shall give sympathetic consideration to the possibility of issuing licences for quantities or values in excess of those indicated in schedules A and B or for products not listed in the above-mentioned schedules.

*Article II.* Trade between the Contracting Parties shall be carried on in the conditions of freedom which result from their respective laws and regulations, except in the case of products listed in schedule C annexed to this Protocol.

*Article III.* This Protocol shall form an integral part of the long-term Trade Agreement.
