## [TRANSLATION — TRADUCTION]

AGREEMENT<sup>1</sup> ON ECONOMIC, INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF THE REPUBLIC OF FINLAND AND THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES

The Governments of the Republic of Finland and the United Mexican States,  
Desiring to strengthen the friendly relations between the two countries through mutually beneficial economic, industrial and technical co-operation and

Recognizing the importance of such co-operation and with a view to creating the most suitable conditions for developing and utilizing the opportunities offered in the areas covered by this Agreement,

Have agreed as follows:

*Article 1.* The Contracting Parties shall endeavour to promote and develop co-operation between the two countries in the economic field—especially industry and trade—and the technical field.

*Article 2.* To this end the Parties shall undertake to promote co-operation in the areas referred to in article 1 by the following means:

- (a) joint preparation and co-ordinated implementation of projects of mutual interest;
- (b) assignment of specialists, research workers and technicians within the framework of such projects;
- (c) exchange of technical know-how, information and publications;
- (d) development of research institutions;
- (e) organization of symposia and exhibitions;
- (f) any other means agreed on by the Parties.

*Article 3.* In accordance with the laws and provisions in force in each country, the competent official institutions, and organizations, enterprises and other entities shall agree on the forms, modalities and conditions of co-operation within the framework of this Agreement.

*Article 4.* The Joint Commission established by the two Governments on 5 April 1974 shall be entrusted with monitoring the implementation of this Agreement. The Commission shall meet at the request of either Party alternately in Finland and in the United Mexican States.

*Article 5.* This Agreement shall enter into force on the date on which the Parties have notified each other of their compliance with the formalities required by their own legislation, for an initial period of five years, after which it shall be automatically extended for an indefinite period unless either of the Parties denounces it, giving six months' notice.

<sup>1</sup> Came into force on 10 September 1976, the date on which the Parties notified each other of the completion of the necessary legal formalities, in accordance with article 5.

Termination in pursuance of the preceding paragraph shall not affect the implementation of ongoing programmes.

DONE at Mexico City, on the nineteenth day of March nineteen hundred and seventy-five, in duplicate in the Finnish and Spanish languages, both texts being equally authentic.
