AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF DENMARK AND THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA REGARDING THE NATIONAL PROGRAMME FOR CONTROL AND PREVENTION OF VISUAL IMPAIRMENT AND BLINDNESS

The Government of Denmark and the Government of India, desiring to strengthen the friendly relations between the two countries and their peoples, recognizing their mutual interest in promoting their economic, technical, and social development, particularly by providing facilities for improving the conditions of life among the rural population of India, and in implementation of the Agreement of 16 February 1970 between the Government of Denmark and the Government of India concerning technical co-operation,² have agreed as follows:

Article I. The two Governments will co-operate in the implementation of the Indian National Programme for Control and Prevention of Visual Impairment and Blindness (hereinafter called “the Programme”).

Article II. The objectives of the Programme shall be to reduce and prevent incidents of visual impairment and blindness through strengthening of ophthalmic services in the following ways:

- (a) Establishment of mobile ophthalmic services in rural areas (Rural Mobile Clinics);
- (b) Establishment and strengthening of the permanent infrastructure for community-oriented eye health care at the peripheral level (Primary Health Centres), at the intermediary level (Taluka and District Hospitals and certain Medical Colleges) and at the central level (State and Regional Ophthalmic Institutes and the National Institute of Ophthalmology); and
- (c) Dissemination of knowledge among the population regarding the common causes of eye diseases in order to prevent such diseases.

The assistance of the Government of Denmark shall be limited to that part of the Programme which relates to the Rural Mobile Clinics, Primary Health Centres, and Taluka and District Hospitals.

Article III. In implementing the Programme, the Government of Denmark and the Government of India shall co-operate as follows:

- (a) The Government of India shall be responsible for the management and operation of the Programme and the maintenance of the equipment supplied by the Government of Denmark under this Agreement;
- (b) The overall management of the Programme shall be under the general supervision of a Central Co-ordination Committee of not more than twenty members. The Government of Denmark shall nominate one member on the Committee, the Chairman of which shall be Additional Secretary, Health, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. The Central Co-ordination Committee shall meet quarterly during the period of implementation;

- (c) The Programme shall be implemented in accordance with annual plans. The plans of implementation for the Indian financial years 1977/78 and 1978/79 are contained in annex I;
- (d) A joint Indo-Danish evaluation of the Programme shall be carried out in January 1979, cf. article VIII. The evaluation report and its recommendations shall be reviewed by the Central Co-ordination Committee and approved by both Governments before Danish funds for the Programme Period 1979/80—1984/85 can be made available;
- (e) The Central Co-ordination Committee shall report annually to both Governments on the progress of implementation of the Programme;
- (f) The Central Co-ordination Committee shall submit annually to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, and to the Government of Denmark audited accounts in respect of the activities financed and/or supported by the Government of Denmark. The Government of Denmark shall receive the accounts not later than six months after the expiry of the financial year under review. The Government of Denmark may request separate itemized accounts for individual activities relating to the commitments of the Government of Denmark of article IV.

Article IV. The commitments of the Government of Denmark under this Agreement shall be:

- (a) To supply equipment for —
 - (i) 80 mobile clinics (vehicles, ophthalmic equipment, health education equipment, etc.),
 - (ii) 5000 Primary Health Centres (diagnostic and therapeutic equipment),
 - (iii) 400 Taluka and District Hospitals (diagnostic and therapeutic equipment);
- (b) To cover part of the recurrent costs of operation of the Mobile Clinics; and
- (c) To cover the costs of Danish participation in the evaluations, cf. article VIII.

The total cost of the aforementioned commitments shall not exceed D.kr. 60 million. The budget for the assistance to be provided by Denmark is set out in annex II.

Article V. The commitments of the Government of India under this Agreement shall be:

- (a) To provide the facilities of the Primary Health Centres, Taluka and District Hospitals, Medical Colleges, and Ophthalmic Institutes selected for the implementation of the Programme;
- (b) To make sufficient and adequately trained staff available for the implementation of the Programme;
- (c) To cover all expenses required for the establishment and operation of the Programme other than those referred to above or falling within the commitments of the Government of Denmark;
- (d) To give representatives of the Government of Denmark access, at any time during the currency of this Agreement, to all institutions and projects for which equipment has been provided or whose operations are financed wholly or partially by the Government of Denmark.

Article VI. The following provisions shall govern the purchase, import and distribution of equipment for the Programme:

- (a) The Government of India shall appoint a Purchasing Committee to be entrusted with the overall responsibility for the purchase and distribution of equipment for the Programme. The Government of Denmark shall nominate one member on this Committee;
- (b) Equipment and supplies to be procured outside India and financed out of the Danish grant shall be purchased by the Danish International Development Agency (DANIDA) in accordance with specifications approved by the Purchasing Committee;
- (c) All imported equipment and supplies shall be delivered c.i.f. Bombay. The expenses incident to distribution, transportation and insurance in India of imported equipment shall be defrayed by the Government of India;
- (d) Taxes, fiscal charges, import duties and demurrage charges, if any, levied on equipment and supplies imported for the Programme by the Government of Denmark in pursuance of article IV of this Agreement shall not be payable by the Government of Denmark;
- (e) Equipment and supplies to be procured in India out of the Danish grant in pursuance of article IV of this Agreement shall be purchased by DANIDA through the Purchasing Committee referred to in (a) above where export prices are obtainable. Otherwise such purchase shall be made by the Government of India and financed by the Government of Denmark either on the basis of reimbursement or by presentation to the DANIDA Mission, New Delhi, of the bill and the receipt of delivery.

Article VII. Equipment provided by the Government of Denmark in pursuance of article IV of this Agreement and imported into India shall become the property of the Government of India upon its arrival in Indian territory. Equipment purchased in India out of the Danish grant shall become the property of the Government of India at the time of purchase.

The Government of India shall ensure that the equipment donated by the Government of Denmark continues to be used for its original purpose after the expiry of this Agreement.

Article VIII. The Programme shall be evaluated twice during the currency of this Agreement.

The first evaluation shall take place in January 1979, cf. article III (d).

The second evaluation shall take place immediately prior to the expiry of the Agreement.

Article IX. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signature and remain in force until 31 December 1985. It may be terminated at any time by either Party giving six months' notice in advance to the other Party.
