Sir,

United Kingdom/Pakistan (Tarbela Number 10) Agreement 1978

1. I have the honour to state that in accordance with the provisions of the Tarbela Development Fund (Second Supplemental) Agreement 1978 (hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement"), and in particular of section 1.01(b) of the Agreement, the Government of the United Kingdom proposes to make available to the Government of Pakistan by way of grant a sum not exceeding 15% of the total non-rupee finance required for the completion of the project for repairs and additional work defined in annex III of International Development Association Report number P-2228-Pak dated February 15, 1978, or £10,000,000, whichever is the less ("the Grant"), as a contribution to the costs of the completion of repairs and further work for the Tarbela Dam Project. I have the honour further to propose that for the purposes of the Grant the following arrangements shall be made:

(i) The Grant shall be used to reimburse the Tarbela Development Fund ("the Fund"), as referred to in the Agreement, for payments made from the Fund by the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development acting as Administrator of the Fund ("the Administrator") in respect of goods and services required for the purposes set out above.

(ii) Drawings from the Grant for this purpose shall be made according to procedures which shall be arranged between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Administrator. These procedures will be notified to the Government of Pakistan by the Administrator.

(iii) The Government of Pakistan shall make such arrangements with the Administrator as are necessary to the effective carrying out of the procedures agreed under the terms of sub-paragraph ii above.

2. If the foregoing arrangements are acceptable to the Government of Pakistan, I have the honour to propose that this present Note together with your reply in that sense shall constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of your reply and shall be known as the United Kingdom/Pakistan (Tarbela Number 10) Agreement 1978.

I avail myself of the opportunity to renew to you, Sir, the assurance of my highest consideration.
