## PROTOCOL¹ ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TRADE MISSION OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS IN THE REPUBLIC OF EQUATORIAL GUINEA

The Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea have agreed as follows:

Article 1. The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics shall have a Trade Mission in the Republic of Equatorial Guinea.

Article 2. The functions of the Trade Mission of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics in the Republic of Equatorial Guinea shall be:

- (a) To promote the development of trade relations between the USSR and the Republic of Equatorial Guinea;
- (b) To represent the interests of the USSR in the Republic of Equatorial Guinea in all matters relating to the foreign trade of the USSR;
- (c) To assist Soviet foreign trade organizations in conducting purchases, sales and other commercial transactions.

Article 3. The Trade Mission of the USSR shall form an integral part of the Embassy of the USSR in the Republic of Equatorial Guinea and shall be located at Malabo.

The Trade Representative and his deputy shall enjoy all the privileges and immunities which, under international law, are accorded to members of diplomatic missions.

Administrative, technical and service staff of the Trade Mission shall enjoy all the privileges and immunities which, under international law, are accorded to members of the corresponding categories of staff of diplomatic missions.

The premises occupied by the Trade Mission shall enjoy the privileges and immunities which, under international law, are accorded to the premises of diplomatic missions.

The Trade Mission shall be entitled to use cipher.

The Trade Mission shall not be subject to the regulations governing commercial registration.

The members of the Trade Mission undertake, without prejudice to the privileges and immunities accorded to them, to respect the domestic laws and regulations of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea.

Article 4. This Protocol shall enter into force on the date of signature.
